Many of our members have been calling and writing interest in my U.S. Senate campaign. It is also the official debut of Stephen M. Kranz, a prominent New Orleas attorney, who has agreed to write a regular column for the NAAWP News. Mr. Kranz has been a long-time friend to the organization, and we're glad to have secured his writing talents.

Because the U.S. Senate campaign demands most of my time, Jim McPherson has stepped in to assume my duties and responsibilities as NAAWP President. I still must urge you to continue your generous support of the NAAWP. We are the biggest and most important civil rights organization in the world dedicated to protecting and preserving the rights and heritage of White people. In my years as NAAWP President, I have watched this organization grow in numbers and in stature. Now, we have a tremendous opportunity before us. Let us not waste, but seize the opportunity!
