

It is unfortunate that we must again attack Mr. Ruppersburg, because our detractors may accuse us of harboring a personal grudge against him. Nevertheless, since he is the author of this iniquitous scheme, we are forced to include him once again on our pages.

Abortion is one of those subjects which the establishment liberals have surrounded with an air of intolerance. Our journalists and professors dutifully attend to their assigned task of convincing the people that it is "chic", "in", "progressive," or "tolerant" to be for abortion. Opposing arguments are treated with sneering condescension as being "old-fashioned" or "unintellectual." Nevertheless, the moral question remains unanswered. When is the extinction of human life murder? Does the human life come within the protection of secular and divine law only after the fetus has left the mother? Or is it permissible to murder infants before they learn to talk? Is it murder to kill a fetus after 8 months, but not at 3? If it is not murder to kill an unborn fetus, is it all right to kill it as it separates from its mother but before it is completely out? We maintain that the extinction of human life without compelling cause (e.g.

danger to the mother's life) is murder. It is murder whether it takes the form of killing off the old and infirm (euthanasia - another liberal "must") or the murder of infants (abortion). We are still awaiting any convincing argument from Mr.

Ruppersburg or other conformist radiclibs showing where they draw the moral line and on what grounds.

And isn't it odd how the conformist radiclibs parrot the establishment line for abortions and euthanasia to kill off the helpless and innocent and then parrot the totally contradictory establishment line against capital punishment for murderers and traitors and rapists? Such a sick mentality must be referred to the psychiatry wards for scientific study and observation, as it is impervious to reason or logic.



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### The Boys and the Band

The hidden hand of the radiclib establishment has struck again at the University of Georgia. Students may not have noticed (the establishment at UGA avoids publicity for such things lest opposition be aroused and alumni withhold funds) but the "Dixie Red Coat band has now become the "Redecat Band."

This was done because blacks supposedly found the word "Dixie" offensive to their delicate sensibilities. Blacks would not play

in the band, so the argument went, if "Dixie" were not eliminated from its title.

The staff of "Right On" is not so naive or gullible as to accept this subterfuge. The real reason why the word "Dixie" was censored and why the song "Dixie" is no longer played at UGA is not because it is offensive to our miniscule black enrollees, but because it is offensive to sick liberals and radicals who

are ashamed of their country and region. The New York fad-setters who determine the "ins" and "outs" of liberalism include as the ultimate goal of the establishment radical-liberal program the erasing of distinctive national and regional cultures. Thus healthy patriotism or regional pride is erased by biased and distorted textbooks, plays, movies, and television programs.

The product of this contaminating mixture is the modern sick liberal or radical who in conformity to his training is systematically against everything to which he should feel allegiance. Thus he is for the Viet Cong and against the United States, for the North and against the South, for the blacks and against the whites. He does not merely want the war in Vietnam to end; it must end with a defeat for the United States to suit him. That the establishment which promotes this sick mentality is aware of its unnatural and abnormal nature is easily shown. For instance, "The Red & Black" on Friday, Oct. 1, 1971, in an article on an establishment (CBS) film "Black History: Lost, Stolen, or Strayed" quoted approvingly:

"Cosby through his illustrations explains why it is so important for black people to be proud of their blackness and all that it encompasses."

There you have the admission. It is important for blacks and other aggressive minority groups to be proud of their so-called culture, but it is intolerable for the sick liberals for white people to be proud of their white, Christian, european culture.

Students must demand that the name of the band be returned to "Dixie Redcoat Band" and that band director Roger Dancz be ordered to play "Dixie" at least twice each football game. If Mr. Dancz, who is known to have approved of this censorship in the past, should prove recalcitrant, he should be fired. Indeed, the football music program in general would probably be better if that was done. At present the half-time shows and nusical performances after touchdowns are scored are not appropriate to football games. They generally consist of "pop" tunes and other renditions which have no place in a football atmosphere. The band should play the school fight songs more citen and save other tunes for other settings. Left wing bigot Dancz has no right to censor the music the students want to hear.

## In Memoriam – Hunguary Oct. 30 – Nov. 3, 1956

"People of the West, listen to our call. Help us not with words but with action, with soldiers and arms. Please do not forget that this wild attack of Bolshevism will not stop. You may be the next victim. Save us...our ship is sinking. The light vanishes. The shadows grow darker from hour to hour. Listen to our cry. Start moving. Extend to us your brotherly hand...God be with you and us."

October 30th through November 3rd will mark the 15th anniversary of the Hungarian Revolution. Truly a spontaneous movement of the people of Hungary to

assert their independence against Communist tyrrany, it was suppressed by the Communist Bloc with unspeakable brutality.

Nor were the Communists unaided in their odiots work. The pro-Communist liberal-radical establishment in the West moved heaven and earth to assist the Reds. Notable among these was the Eisenhower Administration in the United States.

It was the Eisenhower Admi istration which forced Conrad Adenauer of Germany to revoke the permission given to Spanish planes to refuel in Bavaria in order to be able to paraclute anti-tank weapons to the Hungarians. (Fulton Lewis, Jr. in "Exclusive", March 27, 1957, p.1).

And that was not all. Eisenhower also set a telegram to the Communist dictator Tito of Yugoslavia on Friday, Nov. 2nd, 1956, just prior to the second intervention by the Russians. This telegram was nothing less than a come-on to the Russians assuring them of our inaction in case of their intervention. Read what it stated: "The Government of the United States does not look with favor upon covernments unfriendly to the Soviet Union on the borders of the Soviet Union." (State Department telegram quoted by Congressman Michael Feighan (Dem., Ohio) in the Congressional Record, August 31, 1960, p. 17407.)

This Communist Tito later lured some of the Hungarian freedom fighters, including their leader Imre Nagy, into the Yugoslav embassy with a promise of asylum, only to turn them over to the Communists for execution.

Incidentally, some of these young heroes were minors whose executions were postponed by the Kremlin in deference to outraged world opinion. They were later quietly executed while the "Modern Republican" Eisenhower was wining and dining the Butcher of Budapest Nikita Khrushchev in the White House. The Kremlin correctly calculated that the Western press would be too filled with glowing accounts of the Khrushchev visit to cover the executions. Also, the executions were timed to coincide with pictures in the Communist press of Eisenhower embracing the Red dictator and were calculated to do the greatest harm to the will to resist in Central and Eastern Europe.

Informed Americans were sickened recently to see the slobbering, adulatory coverage of Khrushchev by the American press on the occasion of his death. It comforts us to know that all the ink in journalism and all the video-tape in TV were of no avail in sparing this murderous muzhik from his reception by Lucifer for his eternal reward in the hottest fires of the Inferno.
