Those who have not read anything by Schopenhauer might have the misimpression that his books are archaic, academic or dry. This is far from the truth. Schopenhauer provided the foundation for the early idealist period in philosophy. We should pay special attention to Schopenhauer in this atomic age, when our basic principles of statecraft have gone so far astray.

Clausewitz is best remembered for his dictum that war is a continuation of politics. His book makes for especially valuable reading on account of Clausewitz's observations on judicious and injudicious war. Although written during the 1820's while Clausewitz was director of the Berlin Academy (of Warfare), his observations on the principles of politics and war are as fresh as tomorrow. Of him it has been said, "Only if we understand warfare in the spirit of Clausewitz can we hope to maintain our existence in case necessity should once again force the sword into our hands."

Congo Mercenary is a chilling account of the bloodbath which engulfed the Democratic Republic at the Congo in July, 1964, after only four years of independence. The Black rebel army, doped with heroin, struck terror in whole of central Africa. White mercenaries had to be brought in to quell the uprising and restore civil order to the shakey republic. The commander of the mercenary forces tells the story of their four main campaigns that year, and predicts grim

consequences if the emerging African nations are allowed to fall into the grip of communism.

ENVIRONMENT, HEREDITY AND INTELLIGENCE by Arthur R. Jensen, Paperback . . \$6.40

This is the article which embroiled Jensen in a sea of controversy just over two years ago. The near hysteria produced by its appearance has caused Jensen's scientific findings to be all but lost in the tumult. This is the unvarnished treatise which constitutes the most recent word in the science of race differences.

BLASTING THE HISTORICAL BLACKOUT by Harry Elmer Barnes, Paperback \$5.00

Everyone knows that Germany was responsible for starting world War II. But an impassionate examination of the facts reveals a different picture altogether, with the greatest part of the guilt for this tragedy falling on Great Britain. This study, by America's foremost historian (until his recent death,) grew out of a review of A.J.P. Taylor's *Origins of the Second World War*.

RUDOLF HESS: PRISONER OF PEACE. Hardback, pp. 151, Illustrated \$3.75

This book consists of an introduction by Hess' wife and some ninety letters written by the German envoy from prison. Includes the indictment upon which Hess was tried at Nuremberg. The reading of this book raises some compelling question: Why were Hess' proposals for peace spurned by the British authorities in 1941? Why was Hess imprisoned without even the opportunity to make his country's offers known to the English public? And above all, why was Hess ever tried as a war criminal?

THE SPECIOUS ORIGINS OF LIBERALISM by Anthony Ludovici, Hardback, pp. 192 with index \$4.00

Ludovici, an Englishman, started life as an artist and was for a while secretary to Auguste Rodin. He later turned to philosophy and became one of England's most highly recognized lecturers on Fredrich Nietzsche. Ludovici reveals the vacuity of the liberal philosophy. This book is both a plea for reason on the major issues facing our time and an outline of constructive means for combatting the liberal disease.

SUICIDE OF THE WEST by James Burhman, Hardback, pp. 306 with index \$6.95

Does liberalism constitute a death wish for Western civilization? Why can't liberalism cope with the spread of communism? Burnham's analysis has infuriated liberals because of it's inescapable validity.

OPERATION SLAUGHTERHOUSE by John Prcela and Stanko Guldescu, Hardback pp. 557 \$10

Eyewitness accounts of the postwar massacres in Yugoslavia. Relates the terrible suffering of the Croatian people as the communists consolidated their power in Eastern Europe. The fields, rivers and cities were littered with the bodies of more than two hundred thousand Croats, both military and civilian. The publication of *Operation Slaughterhouse* commemorates the twenty-fifth anniversary of the Bleiburg Tragedy, an act of peacetime genocide, which is recounted in its pages.

JEFFERSON AND/OR MUSSOLINI by Ezra Pound, Paperback, pp. 129 \$1.95

Behind the poet and literary critic stood a man of salient political ideas. Pound, in 1933, declared that the Jeffersonian political tradition was very much alive, but not in Virginia, Massachusetts or Delaware; Mussolini's Italy had become inheritor of those political

virtues which made America great. Some may disagree with his thesis, but Pound's observations on the similarities in mind and personality of these two outstanding individuals are both amazing and convincing.
