MHAT IS THE UAP?

The Union of the American People (UAP) is the <u>only</u> moderate to conservative campus political party at the University of Georgia. In the last SGA election, the UAP garnered an unprecedented 20% of the vote, forcing the other two major parties into a runoff. This is a feat never before accomplished in the history of SGA elections. Now political experts on campus are predicting even bigger vote totals next year for the UAP.

Why are students turning to a conservative party in such large numbers? One reason is that the UAP is not afraid to take a stand. The party states its principles and stands beside them.

The UAP had demanded that your student activities money be spent fairly and be accounted for. The UAP exposed the Coalition party's wild financial mismanagement last year, and Coalition lost the election because of this exposure. The UAP stands for the majority student and does not believe in giveaways or bribes to such organizations as the Black Student Union and the Committee on Gay Education (see the opposite column). The Black Student Union received almost \$12,000 in 1973, while the homosexuals got over \$650.

The UAP has demanded the restitution of 'Dixie" at football games and other sporting events. We are not ashamed of cur Southern heritage as are ONWARD and Coalition (the other two political parties). The UAP realizes and states that it is not a crime to be white. There is no reason to be ashamed of

POLITICS HOMOSEXUALS AND OTHER QUEER THINGS ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

As a freshman entering the University, you should be advised about some of the more unsavory things you are going to encounter during your stay here.

Homosexuals here at the University are now in total control of several organizations. They hold dances, meetings and 'dishings' several times a quarter, and they would dearly love to have you there.

The Committee on Gay Education (CGE) is the main homosexual voice on campus. The chairthing of the CGE is Kelly Walton, who performs a female-impersonation act of Liza Minelli, which is sometimes referred to as "Kelly With a Q". While you're in Athens, you'll no doubt run into a weekly newspaper called the Athens Observer. Don't be fooled.

The Athens Observer will tell you that it is a "community newspaper". dedicated to the betterment of Athens and Clarke County. Don't be fooled.

In reality, it's a tool of campus political party Coalition (see right column), which staffs the paper. The Athens Observer also has some links to the Communications Workers of America (CWA), a labor union which is trying to organize the University's workers under it's own leadership (of course). Don't be fooled.

The UAP has been exposing the Athens Observer for what it really is, in spite of threats, both legal and physical, and denial of the facts by that paper. Don't be fooled.

We want you to be warned. This is not a community-oriented newspaper as it claims. They're only in it for their own aims. Don't be fooled.

The University was never meant to hold the vast number of cars it must absorb each day. Traffic Safety Department tells us that there are 20,000 cars and only 10,000 parking places.

So somebody gets cut, and it's the freshmen. You'll be assigned an X-zone sticker, which means you can only park at the Coliseum or Russell Hell. While you're trudging that half-mile or more back to your dorm, you might remember that SGA ministers get all-zone stickers, good anywhere on campus. They can park in any zone they wish - because they happen to be a friend of SGA President J. Rivers Walsh.

We don't think it's right. The freshman shouldn't be forced to be the "nigger" of the University.

dying. 35% of the ONWARD Senators don't bother to show up for Senate meetings. President J Rivers Walsh's friends have been appointed ministers (and have been given all-zone stickers, good anywhere on campus), and so now, the party has no reason to go on. They won the election and now have no desire to do anything else, least of all serve the students who elected them.

You will also encounter blacks on campus. The largest and most vocal of the black groups is the Black Student Union (BSU), which marched on President Davison's office last year with a list of "grievances", including a "demand" for a University-funded "Black Cultural Center" (which would be used by blacks only, while all students would be paying for it), more black teachers and coaches (whether they are qualified or not), more recruiting of blacks, and vague claims that blacks are somehow systematically discriminated against by everybody on campus. The BSU was allocated almost \$9.000 by the ONWARD-controlled Student Senate this year. This comes out to a bribe of \$180.00 per member. That doesn't sound like discrimination to us.

You'll also run into BALSA, the Black American Law Students Association, which has filed suit claiming discrimination against blacks in law school. This claim results from the fact that blacks consistently receive lower grades than white students. This despite the fact that blacks and white both have their papers graded without knowledge of the student's identity! There is no way that blacks can possibly be discriminated against, but BALSA rants and raves on and on.

You'll learn that blacks on this campus receive a wildly disproportionate share of financial aid, and are given special priviledges in the fields of admission and re-admissions. And HEW is demanding that we do more for blacks. They claim that fraternities and sororities with no black members might be forced to integrate - in spite of the fact that it would be a blatant denial of the civil rights of the members.

On your green registration card, you'll have to check your "ethnic background", and if you're white, you'll have to check "other", because you're not as important as a minority student.

You'll be taken advantage of because you're a majority student, and the UAP doesn't think that's right. We invite you to join with us in trying to return control of the University to the average majority student - you!

The UAP will hold an organizational meeting on Wednesday, September 25, at 7 PM in Room 404, Memorial Hall. We invite and urge you to attend. We think it will be in your best interests to be there.
