



# RANDY'S POOR ALMANAC R & B

In keeping with the traditions laid down by his predecessors, Randy Franklin (current editor of the <u>Red</u> and <u>Black</u>) has devoted <u>much</u> editorial space to attacking

the UAP.

In Tuesday, April 29th issue of the <u>R & B</u>, the editorial attacked the Georgia Alumni Association and the UAP. The editorial stated: "It selected a few facts... and concentrating wholly on them, twisted the real situation." (over, please)

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Has the great pay-off begun? In allocations it has. The Union, WUOG, and other Majority-oriented activities must suffer so that blacks, gays and screwballs will be properly funded. After all, the Student Senate does represent the people who voted.

We have been asked if we will continue. The question hardly needed to be asked. Of course the UAP will continue in the struggle until the liberation of the Majority.

During the campaign, we emphasized that the Student Government system was poor and unlikely to get better. More students voted in the Dixie referendum than in any similiar referendum. Nothing happened. Nothing seems likely to happen even now. Majority element students can rightfully wonder if their voice is heeded. In addition, even Coalitionites admitted that the Red and Black downplayed the election, while finding plenty of space for any kind of homosexual hanky-panky.

Yes, it is true that the UAP deals in facts. Perhaps that is why people like Randy Franklin are so afraid of the UAP.

Franklin acusses us of twisting the situation. That situation he refers to is that the SGA has an avowed homosexual for its President; that the SGA Treasurer is a convicted criminal; that the blacks have subverted the right to freedom of speech on this campus through disruption of scheduled events such as Dr. William Shockley's speech in Winter Quarter 1974.

Thus, while we did much poorer than expected, the returns did not contain any kind of endorsement for anyone.

One year of Coalition government should convince all students of the importance of Student Government, especially in the area of allocations.

Thus students can expect an expensive lesson in political power. Those who vote will be represented. Anyone who complains about blue jean days or wasting money should ask himself what he did election day. It might be a cheap lesson, if it is learned this time.

Just what is the real situation, Mr. Franklin? How can "facts", as you put it, such as these do anything but point out the deplorable situation we at the University are in.

If the R & B staff and its spaced-out editor can find nothing better to do than smear and libel the UAP, perhaps it would be just as well if they set up dishing sessions with the gays (sic) and allowed the Black Student Union to hold swordfights in their offices.

Yes, the UAP does deal in facts. To this we admit. We do it to present the pro-Majority side of the picture. But that is a sight better than Franklin's Black fiction and Gay fairy tales, which deal exclusively with the pro-minority, anti-White side of every issue. JIR
