## PERVERSION IN THE CLASSROOM!

The University of Georgia has so sunken into the muck and mire of permissiveness and perversion that it is difficult to believe some of the things which now take place daily. For example:

ITEM: An Associate Professor of English at the University has proudly proclaimed that she is a lesbian. She has participated in and actually addressed a "Gay Symposium" which brought together odd elements from all over the South to wallow in a weekend of praise for queers. These people extoll the virtues of being "gay", praising abnormality as their standard. Of course they are normal when they set the norm. And yet this woman continues to teach at this University as if nothing were out of the ordinary.

ITEM: The "Committee on Gay Education" has been given over \$650 of student money during fiscal 1973-74 by the Coalitioncontrolled UGA Student Government Association. Most recently, the students have been paying for what is euphemistically called a "Gay Crisis Line". This is a telephone dating service for homosexuals. We called one night and were told that we should be proud of being "gay", and that we could meet others of that perverted persuasion on Monday nights at The Last Resort, an appropriatelynamed night-care center. Monday night, we were told, is exclusively "gay night" at The Last Resort.

ITEM: An organization calling itself the "Gay Academics Union" has been formed. According to Kelly Walton, co-chairthing of the Committee on Gay Education, this organization is "primarily for gay professors." We don't think there should be any "gay professors" teaching at the University of Georgia.

ITEM: This same Kelly Walton has addressed psychology classes on the subject of homosexuality. Walton claims that homosexuality is not a disease or a perversion. "Homosexuals can't be cured because they're not sick," said Walton. "They're just different." When asked what advice he would give to an adolescent who is unsure of his "sexual identity" (whatever that means), Walton said: "My advice to him would be to try it with both." "The (homosexual) movement on campus isn't as big as we'd like it to be. We (the CGE) try to meet people... be warm and friendly... try to impress upon people that we're just like they are."

Walton himself is a self-proclaimed "professional female impersonator" and not long ago performed in a one-man (?) show, doing his Liza Minelli impression. Admission was charged to this program of perversion with proceeds going to the Committee on Gay Education. This program was officially sanctioned by the University. Last quarter a homosexual dance was held under the auspices of the CGE with University approval.

It is a shameful fact that the University no longer cares that perversion is being taught and advocated in the classroom. No one is interested that "gay" professors can flaunt their deviance with immunity. It seems that no one will admit that homosexual dances and programs can only lead to more of this perversion. The University, (over, please)

cowed by the attacks of the left, stands mute as it is infiltrated by such degeneracy.

The people of Georgia do have ultimate control over what is done here - after all, they foot the bill. If Georgians are willing to permit all pretense of moral standards to be cast to the winds, then so be it. However, most folks are unaware of what kinds of abnormality is accepted as normal here. The homosexual "flowering" of the past few years is merely another example of the internal sickness and rot that is progressing through the University and society today.

This is madness! This is insanity! And this must come to an end!!

BALSA COMPLAINS (AND COMPLAINS AND COMPLAINS AND ...)

In recent weeks we have been deluged by charges from the Black American Law Student Association (BALSA) that blacks in the University Law School have been harassed, discriminated against, and consistently receive lower grades than white law students. The facts are all to the contrary. Blacks on this campus are consistently awarded special lenient treatment in admissions (and in re-admissions after they have flunked out). No thought was given by BALSA to the possibility that blacks receive lower grades for lesser work. Black students already receive a wildly disproportionate share of loans and other student aid money. The Black Student Union, which claims to represent every black student on campus, received over \$13,000 of student money from the Student Senate last year, and they are coming back for more.

We feel that BALSA'a demands, like the demands of other black students on campus, are ridiculous and unfounded. But the thing that has amused us is a statement in a BALSA letter to the Red and Black, which was printed in that paper's April 23rd issue. BALSA states:

"the Black American Law Students Association at Georgia feels that any further discussion with the Law School faculty and administration would be an utter waste of time ... we will now seek affirmative action from whatever sources available."

Is this a threat?

The Peoples' Observer is also opposed to quotas for unqualified elements. If black law students cannot acheive the grades necessary to complete their study, then they should not be allowed to graduate. If any student cannot do the work, he should not pass the course. When incompetent and unqualified people are merely handed their diploma, it is a slap in the face of those who have worked and struggled to receive theirs. Not only that, but it cheapens the true student's diploma as a valuable commodity.

We stand unalterably opposed to preferrential treatment for black law students.
