The Party's effort to raise \$88,888 for building purposes — dubbed the “Three-Year Plan — ended in April, an unqualified success. Although the Plan actually ran for only two-and-a-half years (from November 1975, through April, 1978), it succeeded in reaching its goal — and then some! Donations received for the Plan postmarked no later than 20 April, 1978, totalled \$89,488.31, nearly \$600 over its target amount.

Late donations, however, pushed the final tally to \$90,058.27, which is \$1,169.39 “over the top!” (A few contributions were still trickling in as this NS Bulletin goes to press).

The Commander hailed the success of the drive as an important accomplishment for the National Socialist movement, and commended all Party members and supporters, both here and abroad, who made it possible.

“Through the dedication and unselfish sacrifice of these comrades,” he said, “we now have a material base from which to begin the professionalization of the Party and make major advances in the coming months. What this means for the overall development of National Socialism in North America will only be fully appreciated in the years that lie ahead.

“In no other movement today,” he continued, “has loyalty

Many times during its course the Plan had fallen behind schedule, causing cynics and Party enemies to speculate that the full amount would not be raised in time. As in the past, however, the dedication and support of Party members, supporters and sympathizers proved them wrong.

The success of the Plan is a concrete achievement that every National Socialist may take pride in. Every dollar raised by the campaign is a weapon which we will use to build a National Socialist revolution on this continent, which in turn will be the basis for the erection of a National Socialist New Order — not only for the United States and Canada, but for Aryans throughout the world.

The Commander and the staff at National Headquarters wish to thank all those who gave to the campaign during its last 20 days, as well as those contributions after the "official" deadline. In all, comrades from 32 states, 1 Canadian province and 3 foreign countries gave to the Plan during the final period.

Party Blasts NBC 'Holocaust' Lies

In an impressive show of unity and coordination, Party units and individual supporters across the country simultaneously blasted the NBC 'Holocaust' mini-series during the week of 16 April.

Party members and supporters organized or participated in demonstrations in seven major U.S. cities. Additionally, many individual supporters across the country conducted anti-'Holocaust' actions of their own, which ranged from writing letters exposing the fraud to local newspapers, to distributing literature. One Florida supporter painted three large plywood signs denouncing the miniseries and attached them to his pick-up truck which he drove all over the state the days the show was broadcast.

Here is a summary of the demonstrations undertaken by Party activists. A full pictorial account appears on page 7 of the June WHITE POWER (Number 85).

ARLINGTON — Commander Koehl led an ST contingent in the picketing of the local NBC-TV affiliate in Washington, D.C. While reporters flocked around the Commander and the police kept a wary eye on the troopers, WHITE POWER editor Martin Kerr slipped on to the station's grounds and handcuffed himself to the guardhouse. The picketing and the handcuffing were shown on that evenings news.

CHICAGO — Midwest Regional Leader Cedric Syrdahl led the Chicago Unit in a picket of the Chicago NBC affiliate. The picket so impressed newsmen that wire-service reports stated that "over 100 Nazis" took part in the picket, when, in fact, the number was well below 100.

CLEVELAND — Local Organizer Douglas Flagg led Party supporters and concerned citizens in a picket of WKYC-TV, the local NBC affiliate. The picketers, who were not in uniform, carried signs reading "Television is Jewish" and "Holocaust a Fraud."

LOS ANGELES — Group Leader Dan Stewart led National Socialists from various Northern and Southern California Party

units which had combined their strengths in Los Angeles to denounce the show. The ST men picketed for two hours, carrying signs which read "KNBC Pushes Jew Lies" and "Six Million Lies." The Jewish Defense League, which had threatened to kill or maim any National Socialists they caught walking the streets of Los Angeles, stood by quietly and took photographs of the demonstration – from a safe distance.

MILWAUKEE – Members of Milwaukee Units I and II, under the leadership of GL Tony Schmitt, conducted a plainclothes picket of WTMJ-TV, which was broadcasting the show in their city. A minor traffic jam was caused by motorists slowing down to observe the National Socialist men and women picketing.

MINNEAPOLIS – TL Steve Martinson, local organizer, led a team of ST men and a team of National Socialist Youth Movement members on a picket of KSTP-TV. The National Socialists carried signs reading "The Holocaust is a Hoax" and "The 'Six Million' Control America." There were no incidents.

NEW YORK – Party activists joined with members of a German-American group to denounce the holocaust in the very heart of Jewry. The National Socialists displayed a huge banner reading "Holocaust is a Hoax," and passed out leaflets demanding equal time in rebuttal.

All in all, the Party's efforts in blasting the 'Holocaust' series were very effective, considering the limited resources and manpower available to us at this time. Nearly every one of the demonstrations mentioned above received news coverage, and millions of White Americans were allowed at least a quick glimpse of the truth amid the quagmire of Jewish falsehoods.

Comrades acting on their own also had quite an effect, which can be judged by the activity reports and newsclippings which were received by National Headquarters.

Minneapolis ST, Jews Clash

A team of ST men led by TL Steve Martinson picketed a \$100-a-plate fund-raising dinner held by the Democratic Party in Minneapolis on 30 April. A number

of big-name politicians attended the event, as did numerous local Jews.

After picketing for only five minutes, the troops were surrounded by a crowd of Jewish Democrats that had left the dinner to gawk at the National Socialist demonstration. The ST men firmly resisted all efforts by the Jews to provoke them by shouting, cursing and so forth. Evidently, the Jews mistook the discipline of the Stormtroopers for fear, and grew bolder.

Finally, one of the enraged Jews made the mistake of deliberately shoving TL Martinson.

He was rewarded for his efforts with a boot to the groin. Another son of Israel took a couple of rights to the head — and the fight was on! The troopers waded into the attacking Jewish mob dispatching one of them after another. Unfortunately the police moved in and broke up the affair before the team of ST was able to administer revolutionary White people's justice to the whole mob.

There were no arrests. TL Martinson suffered a sprained thumb, and another trooper was bitten on the hand. There were no further ST injuries. The battle was covered that evening on KMSF-TV, the local CBS affiliate.

Hampstead man evicted from mall

SALEM, N.H. — A Hampstead man clad in a Nazi storm trooper uniform was ejected from the Rockingham Mall Thursday, the anniversary of the birth of Adolf Hitler, as he distributed copies of White Power, a neo-Nazi publication.

Douglass R. Knight, of East Road, was removed from the shopping mall by Salem police acting on complaints from shop owners.

Knight reportedly told police he was distributing copies of White Power, published by the George Lincoln Rockwell Party Inc., of Arlington, Va., in observance of the Fuehrer's birthday.

Knight's uniform, according to shop owners, included a Nazi swastika armband, brown shirt and black boots.

Knight was not arrested by police and was advised he could distribute literature in the mall parking lot since it is considered a public way in the Granite State, according to Police Chief John Ganley.

Helen Rage, owner of the mall tobacco shop said, "I couldn't believe my eyes. Can you imagine anyone like that appearing after we have been watching 'Holocaust' all week!"

According to bystanders, Knight had little success in distributing what was essentially a birthday card honoring Hitler on what would have been his 89th birthday.

Police oust Nazi from Rockingham Mall

SALEM, N.H. — A 20 year old Westville man dressed in the garb of a Nazi storm trooper was ordered to leave the Rockingham Mall yesterday by Salem police acting on the complaints of incensed store owners.

Douglas R. Knight, East Road, Westville, said he was distributing copies of White Power, the self-styled "revolutionary voice of National Socialism," because Thursday was Adolph Hitler's birthday.

"It's the fuehrer's birthday," Knight explained when questioned by police about his activities in the Salem shopping center.

"Everyone here is furious," one woman shop owner reported. "One woman shopper told him if she had a gun she would shoot him. Hardly anyone would take his newspapers and those who did stuffed them in a trash can right in front of his face."

"I couldn't believe my eyes," said Helen Rage, owner of a Mall tobacco shop. "Can you imagine anyone like that appearing after we have been watching 'Ho'caust' all week."

Knight was dressed in the brown shirt and black boots worn by Nazi storm troopers during World War II.

He wore an armband with the Nazi swastika.

At the Salem police station, he was advised that he could not distribute his literature within the Mall buildings without

the consent of the store owners but could operate from the parking lots in Salem's shopping centers.

According to Police Chief John P. Ganley, parking lots are owned and maintained for the use of the paying public and, in New Hampshire, are considered public ways.

Knight was operating a 1971 Ford with New Hampshire registration plates. The car is listed to Mary Urso, 15 Dyson Drive, Salem.

According to a resident of Dyson Drive, Michael and Mary Urso moved from the Dyson Drive residence a year ago and are living in Burlington, Conn.

The newspaper Knight was attempting to distribute is published monthly by George Lincoln Rockwell Party, Inc. at Arlington, Va.

An advertisement in the March issue Knight was carrying states that the "stormtroopers" are looking for a few good white men and advises that only a "yellow-bellied coward sits by and does nothing while niggers rape his women and turn his cities into jungles."

The same issue carries an advertisement for greeting cards honoring the birth "of the greatest Son of the White Race — Adolph Hitler."

It was early afternoon when Knight left the Salem police station.

There were no further reports to police during the day that he was in Salem.

Westville, Knight's home address, is located about 15 miles from Salem between Plaistow and Kingston.

favorable response to the paper, although some Jews and liberals were upset. For the most part the main reaction to the paper and the uniformed 'Nazi' handing it out was curiosity and interest.

Almost immediately, Jewish store owners called the police, who took a while to arrive.

Eventually, the police asked Comrade Knight to leave, as he lacked permission of the store owners to distribute literature in 'their' mall.

This was the first instance of public activity by a National Socialist in that area of New England, and it received widespread coverage in the local

papers. Comrade Knight reports that the hostility of the reactions to the paper was greatly exaggerated in the news accounts, which over-dramatized the incident.

Reproduced here is the publicity received as the result of this one-man activity.

ACTIVITIES IN BRIEF

● The Commander gave two radio interviews during the second half of April. On 21 April, he spoke over KSOZ located at Pt. Lookout in Arkansas. On 26 April he was interviewed on a KWBZ broadcast from Denver, Colorado, for an hour. This is the second time the Commander has been invited to speak on this station recently. In the broadcasts over both KSOZ and KWBZ, the Commander blasted the "Holocaust" series as well as giving an explanation of the Party's White Power program.

● One paper sale was held by NHQ area activists and three sales were held by the Chicago Unit during the second half of April. The first Chicago sale, which netted \$175, was on 22 April, as was the sale by the NHQ area National Socialists. The second and third Chicago sales were both held on 29 April. One of the sales, on Chicago's south side, brought in \$123. The other, held in the north side of the city, collected \$35.

● Five local units report conducting WHITE POWER or leaflet distributions in the second half of April. Minneapolis Unit comrades led the way by distributing 700 WHITE POWERS on 30 April, after the fight described elsewhere. The Chicago Unit held a WHITE POWER distribution on 22 April, and Milwaukee Unit 1 held two distributions, on 22 April and 29 April. On the West Coast, the Orange County Unit distributed 137 papers on 19 April and comrades in the Tracy-Stockton area held a leaflet distribution on 27 April.

● Unit Leader Rick Cooper of the Tracy-Stockton Unit was in-

Northern California Nazism Still A Political Force

Although Nazism in the United States has been said to be on the rise during the past few years, the National Socialist White Peoples' Party in this area, while not growing significantly in number, is growing in political strength.

Rick Cooper, unit leader of the Tracy headquarters and an official spokesman for the American Nazi party believes there are rewards for his work, "I have political influence and we have come to the point where we have a higher degree of political influence now than five years ago when everybody was running around spray painting freeway buttresses and irrigation pipes with the words white power."

The main ideal behind the party is to

preserve the white race in this country and the world.

Five years ago, Tracy was quite active with the upsurge of American Nazis, but today although Tracy is the Northern California headquarters for the NSWPP there is no building, no meetings, even though the mailing address is still located there.

Cooper, 31, is a graduate of Lincoln High School in Stockton, a graduate of Fresno State with a degree in Math, an Air Force veteran and an American Nazi. Cooper resides in Sacramento, works in Stockton and is unit leader for the NSWPP in Tracy. The enthusiastic Cooper is also a member of the Storm Troopers, a para-military organization for the primary purpose of defend-

ing the party. Rick Cooper is single, lives alone and gives his all to the American Nazi party.


In 1957, George Lincoln Rockwell started the party with National Headquarters in Arlington, Virginia and did such things as one man demonstrations. According to Cooper; "Gradually he attracted a number of individuals who were willing to take risks, chances of losing high paying jobs and material status, to stand up for what they believed in."

Cooper went on to say that, "at the beginning of an organization you get some people who are unsavory of character, you do the best you can with what you have to work with. A lot of people who join the party expect to get immediate results, and when they don't, they get discouraged and drop out. As you build the party and the leadership, you sift out the good people, the people with integrity, honesty and credibility. We get to a point whereswe get a little more refined, and a little more professional and there are people who just don't measure up to standards."

Some of the people who have dropped out, or have been asked to leave for one reason or another have started splinter groups of the National Socialist Party. One such group is the National Socialist White Workers Party headed by Allen Vincent of San Francisco. This man opened the Rudolf Hess Bookstore in the Jewish section of San Francisco and also appeared in a film made by two Stanford students several years ago entitled "California Reich", which deals with Nazism in California. ("California Reich" will be shown at the Stockton Public Library from 7 to 9 p.m. on April 27).

Another splinter group is the National Socialist Party of America, headed by Frank Collin in Chicago.

Both Vincent and Collin were at one time, members of the NSWPP. Cooper feels that, "we have the strength, we have the unity and we have the admiration, respect and jealousy of these other groups. They can't do this themselves because they're too out for themselves."



The NSWPP has a four phase program for assumption of power in the United States. Phase 1 is the "attention getting" phase, including establishing a political party. Phase 2 is building leadership within the party. Phase 3 is the mass movement and Phase 4 is the assumption of power. The NSWPP is now in Phase 2 and feel that the way things are going economically, they should be in Phase 3 in 2 years. According to Cooper, "the thing right now that is holding us from power is the fact that we don't have an economic crisis serious enough to warrant our support. Three things are needed for support of the masses:

1. a race problem
2. a crime problem; and
3. an economic problem

The NSWPP protested the showing this past week of the NBC Television series "Holocaust", "on the grounds

that it is based on historical inaccuracies, indicts our philosophy, is unfair to the German people, is unfair to Christian people and, above all, is contentious!" This is stated in a letter from Cooper to KCRA TV in Sacramento requesting time to provide an alternate viewpoint to the "Holocaust" series.

Cooper feels the the 6 million myth is "a lot of baloney". This subject is fully explored in the book: "The Hoax of the 20th Century", written by A.R. Butz of Northwestern University. When asked how they came up with the 6 million number, Cooper replied, "I have no idea, I'd like to know myself. Actually I think what they did was, they took the Jewish population for each country in Europe, and they must have added up those figures, because if you take the total Jewish population of Europe at the height of German power, you come up with barely over 6 million. So that means that they would have had to kill every Jew that they got their hands on, but we know from immigration statistics that most of them fled; some to Russia, some to the Middle East, but most to the United States."

"The hardest thing that we have to overcome is the propoganda warfare. People are so convinced that there were 6 million Jews killed. A lot of people are coming around know, and realize that there is some question as to the number killed and just what went on in World War II. Eventually they will see the truth; the Jews expose themselves. We're an idealist organization, based on ideals, not history," says Cooper.

interviewed by *Signal*, the newspaper of California State University Stanislaus campus. Comrade Cooper's interview covered the Party's basic ideology, the "hol-

Uniformed Nazis stir controversy at Hersey

The appearance of two uniformed Nazi speakers at Hersey High School in Arlington Heights Wednesday stirred up controversy among students and parents who feel the timing was all wrong.

"With emotions running high because of the showing of 'Holocaust' on television, the tension in Skokie (over the proposed Nazi march there) and Passover starting Friday, the timing couldn't have been worse," senior Linda Haase said.

Unaware that the Nazis would be at Hersey to address two morning sociology classes studying minorities, Linda said she was "shocked" when a friend greeted her with "You're not going to be-

lieve who's here and what they're saying about us."

"MY KNEES WENT out from under me," she said. "It terrified me to think there were Nazis in my school, on my home ground."

Alex Schmidt, chairman of Hersey's social science department, said the Nazis were allowed into class at the request of students who wanted to know what kind of person would be attracted to a "hate group," one of the topics being discussed in the class study of minorities.

"To have said no, the Nazis can't appear in class would have added mystery and glamor to the students' concept of them," Schmidt said. "We thought this was the best way to expose stu-

dents to the kinds of dangers hate groups pose."

For these same reasons, the Nazis were allowed to go ahead with their presentation even though they showed up in full uniform after being asked not to do so, Schmidt said.

"IT'S DIFFICULT to decide what we talk about and who we allow to talk about it," sociology teacher Charles Birch said. "We want to give students an opportunity to hear a wide range of viewpoints and to develop an inquisitiveness and a love for knowledge."

In the past, this philosophy has meant devoting sociology class time to hearing from homose-

xuals, rabbis, priests and teachers of the handicapped, he said. Friday, students in the minority groups class will be addressed by the director of the Northwest Opportunity Center on the problems minority groups have overcoming prejudice in the Northwest suburbs, he said.

Joel Reznick, one of several parents who Wednesday called Hersey to complain about the Nazi presence in the school, said he didn't object so much to what the Nazis said as to the uniforms they wore.

"I don't think it's wrong for anyone to espouse ideologies, particularly as part of an educational experiment, but when people come to do so in a uniform that is the symbol of mass murder, I have to be opposed," he said.

"If they had talked without the symbolic accoutrements of ha-

tried it wouldn't have been merely a concept, but the armbands and swastikas gathered up terrible remembrances and made it something more."

ONE STUDENT found the Nazi presentation so objectionable he walked out, but the others heard them out and then challenged their rhetoric, Birch said.

"The kids did a good job ripping the characters to pieces," Schmidt said. "The Nazis were flustered for a good part of the time."

Linda, however, is not satisfied with this.

"For every 100 people who walk away thinking the Nazis are absolute fools there might be one thinking hey, this is pretty neat, and that's frightening," she said.

"When painful, controversial issues are presented, it's hard to measure the benefits," Birch said. "I have mixed emotions."
