A New Year's Resolution for All National Socialists

One of the biggest obstacles in the path of National Socialism today is the non-activist attitude of many adherents. The "National Socialism-is-great-and-l'll-send-in-my-monthly-donation" attitude seems to be present in the majority of NSWPP followers.

The time has come for this kind of thinking to stop!

Neglect of Party activity became painfully apparent when a spot check revealed that fewer than 50% of the readers of the *NS Bulletin* had sent a Yuletide greeting card to Rudolf Hess (as suggested in issue No. 30). Further polling disclosed that an even lower percentage of Party supporters have actually been carrying out the suggested activities of the month.

There is a category of Party Supporters who feel they're doing their part for the Movement by merely believing in National Socialism and by reading Party publications. "Activism," they always reason, "is for someone else;" that by sending in their donations, they absolve themselves of further responsibility to the Movement until their next contribution is due. Perhaps they do not realize that the Party works to recruit new Supporters not just for the money they contribute, although greater sums of money must be brought in to keep pace with Party growth. New Supporters are brought in as much for their activist potential as their ability to contribute money. The people who work their way up to positions of leadership in the Movement are invariably energetic activists, not those who have given the greatest sums of money.

There are two types attracted to the NSWPP who have little potential of ever becoming effective National Socialist revolutionaries: (1) Those for whom National Socialism is a hobby. Frequently, it is one of several hobbies which absorb their spare time and money. Hobbyists, as a rule, lose interest in National Socialism gradually, unless they're called upon to do something really worthwhile for the Movement, in which case they lose interest immediately. (2) Those who consider rolling up their sleeves and getting to work for the Party as a "favor". I have seen this type of person become quite miffed if not properly "thanked" by the Party leadership for carrying out a detail on the Movement's behalf. The prima donna type is often a member of the hobbyist category as well, and he totally misunderstands the ideals of duty and self-sacrifice.

It is hoped that readers who see any of these traits in themselves will resolve to purge them out immediately.

Most National Socialist non-activists have fallen down on the job for one of two more innocent reasons: (1) They feel like actually getting out and doing something is just too much trouble. They are ignorant of the necessity for activism in a revolutionary movement. No matter how great an idea, it will never develop into a movement unless the people who believe in the idea are willing to act! (2) They erroneously believe that activism is only possible for full-time Staff Members or people without families and job responsibilities. Most people who believe this think there's nothing that can be done without exposure as a "Nazi" and consequent loss of employment. As a rule, they have never before engaged in any Party activity and, consequently, have no idea what can be gotten away with. As a matter of fact, Party activists almost never lose their jobs, and many even carry on Party activities for years in complete anon-yrmity.

The true revolutionary attitude was expressed recently in a letter from an NSWPP comrade: "I have reached the point where I can't sleep at night for thinking about the cowardice of our people. It seems like nobody will stand up and fight for his race.

"I have decided I have to do more for the Party, much more than I have been doing. If I get killed, at least I will die knowing that in some small way I have done something to save my race and my children.

"You will be hearing a lot more about National Socialist activities in my city, if I have to do it all by myself."

Revolutionary activism does not necessarily require putting on an armband and picketing in the streets. In fact, the rash public demonstrations of Phase One, which were strictly for the purpose of getting publicity, have been passed over for more systematic forms of recruiting and organization-building of Phase Two. Now people from all walks of life can serve the Movement in a meaningful way. Every dedicated National Socialist, be he man, woman or youth can do something valuable for the Cause.

Even before thinking of projects to start in your community, you must firmly resolve to *act* no matter what obstacles may confront you. You must determine that every spare minute of your life will be spent in furthering the ideals of Adolf Hitler and the NSWPP, and, in spite of your personal circumstances, you will find a way to serve the Movement.

Your work for National Socialism can take any form from organizing distributions for passing out Party literature to signing up new Supporters. If you can not devise an activity which will reasonably fit into your personal circumstances, write a letter to National Headquarters and an activity will be suggested to you.

As the atmosphere in American life becomes more revolutionary, activism will be expected in greater degrees from Party adherents. A passive, intellectual commitment to National Socialism will not be sufficient to recommend a person for Party membership. In fact, activism is already becoming one of the major criteria upon which applicants for membership are judged.

To initiate this program of greater activism for National Socialists, Members and Membership Candidates will be expected to faithfully perform the suggested Activity of the Month or an equally effective activity in their localities. To assist people in devising activities, a paper will be published in early 1969 for all Members and Supporters, which will suggest projects which anyone will be able to carry out.

A sample activity form has been prepared for Members and Membership Candidates, which will be sent out each month with the first issue of the NS Bulletin. Starting in February, this form should be filled out regularly each month with a complete description of the previous month's activities and returned with dues. A sample copy of the Activity Report is enclosed with this issue of the Bulletin. Those persons who intend to become Members in the future are urged to send in regular activity reports for evaluation when membership is requested. An Activity Report will be sent each month to all persons willing to do something to help promote the Cause.

Any Aryan person, regardless of his age, sex, vocation, or social station' can actively serve National Socialism. As the new year approaches, make your resolutions for National Socialism: Resolve to put nothing ahead of daty to your Race. And make your resolution stick!
