Mechanized Production Aids Propaganda Flow

The following pieces of production and mailing equipment acquired by the Party either new or used over the past months has greatly increased propaganda output. Each one of these pieces of equipment has been carefully selected for its capability of raising not only the quantity but also the quality of printed matter put out by the NSWPP. You may have noticed that the appearance of Party material has been gradually improving. This trend will continue as our staff becomes more adroit in the use of these excellent machines.


New Time-Saving Equipment Raises Output-Cuts Costs



This is a cold-type composing machine. Although it looks much like an ordinary typewriter, it does nearly the same job as a gigantic linotype machine, which would fill up a whole room and require a highly trained technician to operate. This machine has the capability of setting justified copy, that is, setting parallel lines of type so that all lines are exactly the same length, like the lines of this paragraph. In addition, the type faces can be changed quickly and effortlessly to a multitude of type styles and sizes.



This is a headliner, a machine which sets the large headlines for Party literature. This machine automatically does the work in a few hours that used to take days of painstaking hand labor to accomplish. In minutes, the headliner can set a row of large letters in any type face or size required. Shown to the left of the headliner are some of the type faces and sizes which can be set by this machine.



This printing press is used to run off small brochures, leaflets and pamphlets. It was bought by the Party used at a fraction of the new price. This press is equiped with time- and labor-saving attachments which greatly increase its utility. It has a capability of printing both sides of a sheet of paper at once, something most presses can not do. With this machine, the Party can produce 50,000 leaflets, printed on both sides, in a day's time. Often it is kept rolling day and night.



This is a Graphotype machine, a component of the Party's automated mailing system. The Graphotype makes an address plate which is used in another machine to instantly address a piece of mail. The plates made by this machine resemble minature license plates which contain your complete name and address. All of these plates are kept in a safe place under double lock.



This is the Addressograph machine which uses the plates made by Graphotype. In addition to instantly addressing letters, the plates used in this machine can be coded with pertinent data about each individual addressee. This enables the machine to automatically pick out any group within our list to which we want to make a mailing. For example, if we want to mail out the latest issue of the newspaper to all subscribers, the machine simply has to be set up to pick out the plates which are coded for "newspaper subscription paid." It will print only those and none others, and will put the address plates back into alphebetical order after it has finished. Since each address plate can be coded twenty-four different ways, each person has to have only one plate in the file even if he gets every mailing put out by the Party.

The NS Bulletin is mailed to you in an envelope addressed by the Addressograph machine.

Both the Graphotype machine and the Addressograph machine were purchased and are used by the Party at an amasingly inexpensive price.



The machine at the left has cut the time required for mass mailings down to a fraction. It is an automatic postage machine. This small machine will seal, and put postage on up to 13,500 pieces of mail an hour. But speed of operation is only one outstanding feature of this machine. Mail with printed postage is handled by the post office much faster than mail with postage stamps because metered mail already has the date printed on it. Therefore, there is no need for the post office to take time to cancel the stamp.

In addition to printing the postage, this machine will also print an ad on the front of the envelope by the meter stamp. The prize-winner in the recent postage meter ad contest will soon be used with this machine. The amazing capacity for sealing and posting mail has greatly reduced the time required for preparing mailings. Now mail can be gotten out within just a few hours of the time it comes off the press.

The machines pictured here have increased the Party's ability to produce top-quality publications in large quantities and get them into the mail to National Socialists all over the world in a fraction of the time it used to take. But these are only a sample of the machines which will be needed to keep up with the Party's output of literature in the next few years ahead. Each piece of machinery purchased by the Party has greatly increased our operating efficiency. As we begin to work with greater numbers of people, more and bigger machines will be needed to handle the load.
