Resolutions for the New Year

With the time for making New Year resolutions at hand, National Socialists are reminded of the great responsibility facing those people who have embraced our race-saving idea. Just as resolutions for self-improvement, such as breaking an addiction to cigarets, inevitably builds one into a stronger individual, resolutions for more determined, dynamic activism on the part of every National Socialist will help build a stronger Movement. The strength of the Cause will always be determined by the willingness of its followers to work and sacrifice for it.

In 1968 the Party called for active participation from all National Socialists in building up the Movement in their localities. A big push was added to the local activist policy with the introduction of monthly activity reports just one year ago. Both of these moves brought strident objections from some individuals who had been satisfied to fulfill their obligation to the Movement by reading Party publications from the comfort and safety of their homes and observing the travail of the Movement from afar. Their opposition to the activist policy was further manifested by their failure to file regular activity reports with Party Headquarters.

In the past year, staunch Party activists have proven that there is no substitute for personal involvement in the work of building the Movement. The hard work of those who've thrown themselves into NS activities has borne out the effectiveness of this principle. Their efforts have already begun to work like yeast in warm dough. In towns where we had only one activist a year ago, we now have three or four, and usually a score or more of helpful sympathizers. And National Headquarters is receiving a steady flow of new inquiries and Official Supporter applications from areas where National Socialists have been proportionally active. All of this has been accomplished with almost no loss of employment or school expulsions, and surprisingly little physical injury to those responsible for all this headway.

This is a real sign of success for our tactics, and it proves that you can do the same thing no matter where you live. But you can't do it by merely wishing. It takes many hours of hard work and planning—and just as much patience. Progress is often slow at first, especially where one person begins by himself.

It is essential for every National Socialist to understand that he can do something valuable and meaningful for the Cause, regardless of his finances, sex, occupation or social station. The Movement draws its strength from Aryan men, women and young folk from all walks of life. If you are willing to give the required time and energy—to show the determination and tenacity for Party activity as other comrades have done—things will really start to boil in your area after a while!

There is no way for those who see the task before us to compel you to take the word forward in your community. The responsibility rests on you. So we're asking you to make the most important resolution of your life. Resolve

to make Party activism a part of your life, no matter what stands in your way. This will truly be the most rewarding goal you can possibly set for yourself in life. The rewards for making and sticking to this commitment will not come in the form of material pleasures or luxuries, but in the pride of knowing that you are fulfilling a valuable role in the most crucial struggle of our race's history.

You are reminded of the advisability of keeping Party Headquarters informed of your work and progress. This should be done by filing a monthly activity report with this office. Your activity report will also serve as a reminder to you throughout the year of your resolution. A report form will be sent to you each month along with the NS Bulletin for you to record your previous month's work for the Party and return with your dues.

Please fill out the enclosed slip and return it so we'll know that you are joining us in making a New Year's resolution for greater personal activism. We'd also like to know that you're going to send in monthly activity reports to keep us abreast of your progress. Let us hear about your resolution today!
