North American Congress Forges New Solidarity

One hundred twenty-one delegates from 24 states and provinces were on hand for the second annual North American Congress of the World Union of National Socialists which was held in conjunction with the National Socialist White People's Party in northern Virginia over the Labor Day weekend, 5-7 September.

Despite earlier defeatist rumors that the Party would be unable to hold a congress this year, the Congress proceeded on schedule and without a hitch as delegates from all over the United States and Canada came together to demonstrate once again the unshakable solidarity and inner vitality of our Movement.

After the assembly was welcomed by Commander Koehl on Saturday morning, Robert Homan spoke on the "Pathology of the System," describing in detail the symptoms of the decline of Western civilization and the role of the Jew in this decline.

The Commander then spoke on the subject, "The National Socialist Faith," in which he pointed out that National Socialism represented the opposite of all the sickness and decadence of our time and that the new world we were trying to build stood completely apart from the old bourgeois-bolshevik world. He emphasized that National Socialism was more than a matter of sterile intellectual persuasion--that it had a spiritual dimension and involved deep feelings and attitudes best exemplified in the heroism and idealism of the great heroes of our Movement.

The Saturday afternoon session began with reports from local leaders. This was followed by an examination of "Problems of the Movement" by Commander Koehl. The Commander showed how all essential problems of the Movement really boiled down to a matter of personnel. By recruiting just a small number of highly-motivated, competent persons for several key areas, he declared the Party could make enormous strides in the next few months.

The Sunday morning session was devoted to a discussion of essential National Socialist doctrine. Commander Koehl led off by showing how the teachings of Adolf Hitler, as given in Mein Kampf, formed the basis of National Socialism. Robert Homan then went on to point out how Lincoln Rockwell not only elaborated these teachings for the entire modern Aryan world, but how he gave the key to National Socialist victory as well with his doctrine of will and activism.

After adjourning for an outdoor rally in the afternoon, the Congress reconvened Sunday evening for formal ceremonies, which began with the playing of the Badenweiler March. A special memorial tribute was paid to Commander Rockwell, who three years ago gave his life as a blood sacrifice for our holy Cause.

A highlight of this year's ceremonies was the consecration of the 16 National Socialist martyrs who fell in the Munich revolt of 9 November 1923. As flames rose from a gleaming crucible set before the Swastika banner and the strains of the anthem, "White Men to Arms," filled the darkened hall, the Commander solemnly read the name of each martyr, declaring that together they will now stand as a common symbol for our Movement.

The Distance Prize this year went jointly to James Friesen of Vancouver, B.C., and George Magas of Burnaby, B.C.--two young Canadians who traveled the furthest distance to be at the Congress. Each of them received a free set of color slides of National Socialist Germany.

Following the ceremonies, there was a showing of Leni Riefenstahl's immortal film classic of the 1934 Nuremberg rally, "Triumph of the Will."

The Monday morning session included a talk on "Local Organization" by Louisiana activist Dave Duke, in which he stressed the importance of "action, action, action" in reaching new people and building the Movement. Bill Kirstein then discussed "The Role of National Socialist Youth" in the building of a new world.

In his concluding remarks, the Commander cited the growing revolutionary ferment in this country and pointed to the great opportunities for a National Socialist alternative in the vacuum situation that is emerging. He declared that leadership and direction would not be provided for the masses of our people in the days to come by those sitting around in the safety of their drawing rooms spinning fancy theories and hatching clever schemes, but only through the politics of confrontation in which National Socialists actively sought confrontation with the worst recognizable enemies of our race and by establishing an image of militancy within the White community by clashing with these enemies continuously and consistently.

Unable to Attend Congress

A Party activist from Toledo, Ohio, who had long been planning to attend this year's Congress wrote this letter to National Headquarters on 27 August:

"I just got out of the hospital yesterday. The reason I was in the hospital was because of a beating I received five days ago. On Friday, August 22, I was standing on a street corner selling the Party newspaper when I was approached by six Blacks. They tore the newspapers out of my hand and hit me over the head with a glass bottle. I tried to defend myself, but six-to-one isn't even odds. They knocked me down on the sidewalk and kicked me repeatedly in the side.

"Finally after a few minutes, a White police officer spotted the incident and called out to them to stop. They fled on foot before the policeman could catch them. He helped me up and called a patrol wagon. I was taken to Mercy Hospital receiving center, where I was admitted. I had two broken ribs and two lesions on my forehead. My wife is scared to death after three threats against me by these apes. But I am not going to let that stop me. I am more determined than ever to continue working for our great Movement."

Mall Rally a Smashing Success

One of the main events of the Party Congress this year was a public rally in L'Enfant Square on the Mall in Washington which drew a crowd of over 2,000.

The speaker's platform, decorated with a "National Socialism Is for the White Man" banner and a huge Swastika, was flanked by a security force of nearly 50 men. Stationed in front of the regular security line was a flying squad of 12 additional troopers. Out in the crowd facing the platform an enormous "Free Rudolf Hess" banner was carried by several more men.

As four powerful bullhorns boomed out against the nearby National Archives and Smithsonian buildings, Party speakers delivered the National Socialist message to all comers. With Bill Kirstein chairing the meeting, speakers included Commander Koehl, Robert Homan and Dave Duke.

Bob Homan led off by outlining the contribution of the White man to Western civilization. He went on to examine the causes for the rise and fall of great civilizations, relating this to the situation in America today.

Commander Koehl spoke next, pointing out that the National Socialist racial stand was based not on hate or bigotry, but on a deep love and concern for our own people. He explained the concept of racial idealism, which recognizes that there is more to life than a mad scramble after the Almighty Dollar and material things. He said we did not hate Jews because they were Jews or Blacks because they were Blacks, but that we opposed both groups to the extent that they represented threats to the security and well-being of our own race.

In his remarks, Dave Duke appealed to the anti-establishment sentiments of young people present by emphasizing that National Socialists also want to smash the System. He pointed out that unlike our bolshevik opponents, we recognized the true nature--the Jewish nature--of the System, and that therefore only we could be considered true revolutionaries capable of destroying that System. Duke was really making points with a large number of the young persons when a fresh rain of bottles from Jewish agitators in the crowd caused a police lieutenant to halt the rally.

Jewish-bolshevik provocateurs had been shouting obscenities and throwing pop bottles at the speaker's platform intermittently all afternoon. One young Party supporter was taken to the hospital with a bad facial cut after being struck by a flying bottle, but was later released. Another National Socialist, Trooper Richard Biederman, received a different kind of injury: He smashed his hand pretty badly up against some creep's teeth.

Capt Chris Vidnjovich was also on the injured list after he was jumped by about 20 of the enemy. He was saved from serious injury by Tom Bleming who came to his aid. Bleming just got back from a combat tour with the paratroops in Vietnam. Capt Vidnjovich earlier prevented an attack on the speaker's platform when he singlehandedly maced a dozen creeps whom he caught using filthy language.

Despite the disruption and breakup of the rally by police, hundreds of White people who turned out were visibly impressed by the force of the new doctrine as it was brought home to them, point by point--like one hammerblow after another--and they began to realize for the first time how they had been lied to all these years. Without question, this was the most successful outdoor rally held so far by the Party in the Capital area.

White Student Alliance Organized

The formation of a new broad-based organization for White high-school and college students was announced at the Congress by Dave Duke, a senior at Louisiana State University.

The new organization, which will replace the National Socialist Liberation Front, is called the White Student Alliance. It will be action-oriented in the same sense the Marxist SDS and the Black Student Union are.

The WSA is open to all non-Jewish White students who support the principles of racial idealism and a White America, and will allow for full National Socialist participation. It will provide wonderful opportunities for establishing valuable contacts among White students who share essentially the same point of view on racial matters, but who are not yet ready to identify themselves fully with the National Socialist cause.

A copy of The Racialist, the official monthly publication of the WSA, is enclosed with this Bulletin. All National Socialists who are students are urged to join this new organization and actively carry the racial fight to their campuses.

Annual membership dues are \$5. Persons currently holding NSLF membership will automatically have their memberships transferred to the new organization.
