Voter Boycott Urged by Arlington WPM

In a special White Power Message from National Headquarters, Commander Koehl urged Washington-area residents not to vote in the 3 November elections. He explained that the voting ritual was a big farce because the voters weren't given a real choice. He declared that whoever won, nothing would be changed and the basic problems of the nation would go unsolved.

Following the appeal, about 40% of all eligible area voters failed to cast ballots, and approximately another 15% or 20% didn't even bother to register for the elections. The Commander declared the voter boycott was very significant, because it proved that none of the candidates represented the will of the White people of the community.

The American Nazi Party, or, more correctly, the National Socialist White People's Party of America, is telling northern Virginians not to vote in Tuesday's general election.

By dialing 528-4361, you can hear the message straight from party headquarters at 2507 N Franklin Road, Arlington.

Nazis Urge Voters To Snub Elections

The American Nazis are telling area voters to stay away from the polls next Tuesday.

On an Arlington telephone recording, Matt Koehl, commander of the National Socialist White People's Party, says the elections won't change a thing . . . while all the political quacks keep offering their phony nostrums."

He tells callers to "say no to the two-party swindle" by not voting. He said that after the election the country will "still have black crime, pollution, the Vietnam farce, and U.S. involvement on behalf of the Jews in the Middle East."

National Socialists Lead White Student Protest

National Headquarters was recently approached by a group of young people from nearby Alexandria who were highly concerned about Black terrorism and atrocities at their high school and looking for ways to do something about the situation. A Party representative got together with leaders of the group and two very successful organizational meetings have been held so far, attended by approximately 75 youths. Many of them participated in picketing the home of the school superintendent. Several White Power rallies are now being planned under the sponsorship of the White Student Alliance.

School Cross Burning Incidents Under Investigation By Police

Two cross burnings in the city last night seem to have followed a 7 p.m. meeting of white high school students with members of the National Socialist White People's Party.

Police reports show that two eight foot two-by-fours wrapped with a blanket were burned on the grounds of George Washington High School about 8:30 last night. About 20 subjects, ranging in age, according to police, from 15-35, were found in the rear of Maury School shortly thereafter attempting to erect another cross.

The subjects identified themselves as members of the "American Nazi Party," and stated it was their aim to instruct students to defend themselves from blacks, according to police.

Captain William Kirstein of the Arlington based white supremacy group said this morning the students were members of a group dubbed the White Student Alliance who attended an organizational meeting last night.

Kirstein said his group did not authorize the cross burnings, but that he understood the reason for them. Last night's incidents were the third and fourth in the city in less than two weeks.

Cross burnings are in violation

of a 1968 state statute, 18.1-365, making it illegal to burn a cross on private or public property with the purpose of intimidating a person or group of persons. A burning cross, the statute holds, is prima facie evidence of a violation of the law.

Kirstein referred to the rash of violence in the schools, recently, citing the principals (especially Richard Hills, of George Washington High School) with being too concerned with black problems, and afraid of "black pressure."

A Sunday rally is being planned by the political group, who hope to "give the kids leadership, organize them, and instill in them an attitude of white racial pride."

"The kids don't have any leadership," Kirstein said. "Hell, the governor of the state actually took his children to integrated schools. Now what kind of leadership is that?"

Police this morning said they are investigating the incidents.

Meanwhile, the white power party has a special member, Richard Biederman, who is organizing the White Student Alliance as a special project of the group formerly headed by George Lincoln Rockwell, and now led by Commander Matt Koehl.

Neo-Nazis Picket School Official's Alexandria Home

A group of about 30 persons who identified themselves as members of the National Socialist White Peoples' party last night picketed the home of Alexandria School Supt. John C. Albohm.

Carrying signs and wearing white power buttons, the group charged that Albohm has permitted "black terrorism" in the city's high schools. The demonstrators, who associated themselves with the former American Nazi Party, remained in front of Albohm's home at 1115 Anderson St., Lincoln Hills, for about a half-hour before police arrived at 9 p.m.

Discipline problems, particularly at George Washington and T. C. Williams high schools, have increased in the city's middle and high schools this year.

On November 1, an eight-foot-high cross was burned on the grounds of George Washington High School. Albohm said he has received several threatening telephone calls.

Nazis Picket At Home of School Head

About 30 members of the National Socialist White People's Party, formerly known as the American Nazi Party, last night picketed the home of Alexandria School Supt. John C. Albohm, accusing him of permitting "black terrorism" in the city's schools.

The group, wearing "white power" buttons and carrying placards, shouted and marched in front of the superintendent's house at 1115 Anderson St., in the city's Lincoln Hills section, from about 8:30 to 9 p.m. They left as police arrived.

Albohm said last night he had received several "irritating and threatening" telephone calls, and said there have also been at least two crosses burned at city schools in recent weeks.

BLACK TERRORISM IN HIGH SCHOOLS across the country is steadily increasing. Nazis threaten

Swastika posters were sprayed deliberately on two synagogues in Vancouver on Sunday, Aug. 16, on the Beth Israel Synagogue, and on the Schara Tzedek Synagogue.

Nicely, nicely, these incidents were reported on one radio station.

On the same day a member of the Jewish community swimming at Spanish Banks, was approached by a middle-aged man who handed him two "National Socialist white papers," Nazi handbills with Nazi swastika emblems on them.

Reading this trash, the Jewish person ran after the Nazi, and came upon a late model car in which four men wearing Nazi shoulder arm bands were seated.

The Jewish man told the men in the car that there was a Canadian law to prevent dissemination of racial hatred.

When told that the police were being called, the men fled in the car.

The hate literature's address was Arlington, Virginia, seat of the neo-Nazi party.

L.A. STORMTROOPERS BEAT OFF RED ATTACK

Using clubs, a strong ST contingent led by Lt Joseph Tommasi beat off a Red attack during a treason demonstration by 1,000 Marxists in downtown Los Angeles on 31 October. The Red demonstration included such a weird assortment as the Black Panthers, the SDS, the Brown Berets and the Gay Liberation Front.

The National Socialists assembled at City Hall and marched 10 blocks with an unfurled Swastika flag and a huge banner reading "White Power" to Pershing Square where the Reds were gathering. Police intervened to prevent a serious confrontation by the National Socialists against the Reds.

Lt Tommasi has recently appeared on two local television programs and attracted tremendous interest in the Movement. As a result, the Los Angeles headquarters at 4375 N. Peck Road in El Monte has been deluged with new inquiries.

Nazis top Senate ticket

The Australian National Socialist Party (the Nazis) today drew the blue ribbon position at the top of the Queensland ballot paper for the Senate election on November 21.

The draw was made soon after midday today, following the close of nominations, under the supervision of the Commonwealth Electoral Officer, Mr. I. F. Weise.

There was an audible groan around the tension-packed Commonwealth Electoral Office in Edward Street as the National Socialists were pulled first out of the box.

They were followed, in the plum No. 2 position, by the three-man Democratic Labor Party team.

The Pensioners Party of Queensland came out third, the A.L.P. fourth, and the Government team fifth and last.

An independent pensioner candidate will have his name on the right-hand side of the ballot paper, away from the others.

The Australian National Socialist Party has only two candidates and the name of DLP Senator V. C. Gair will be third on the ballot paper.

Political observers regard this as a tremendous boost to his chances of retaining his seat.

The secretary of the DLP, Mr. W. Hutchinson, said: "We are pleased indeed at the outcome. In the

past two Senate elections in Queensland we drew first position. Second place is the next best thing."

In New South Wales the order is: Australian Democratic Party, Australia Party, National Socialist, Pensioner Power Association, A.L.P., DLP, Lib.-CP.

In Victoria: Australia Party, Country Party, National Socialist, DLP, Council for Defence of Government Schools, A.L.P., Liberal.

In South Australia: A.L.P. second, DLP fourth, Government fifth. Minor parties in other positions.

In Tasmania, order of main parties: Lib., A.L.P. DLP.
