Commander Koehl Tours South, Far West

Commander Koehl, accompanied by William Kirstein, recently completed an extensive trip through the Southern and Western U.S. Highlights of the Commander's schedule are as follows:

2 March Commander Koehl met with Party Members and Supporters in western North Carolina and discussed plans for moving the Party ahead in that area.

3 March The Commander greeted Party people in Huntsville, Ala., where there was a showing of the motion picture "Triumph of the Will." He met with students deep in "Wallace country" who are disgusted with the Federal Court ban on the playing of "Dixie" and the displaying of the Confederate flag. Alabama Gov. George Wallace has done nothing to defy this arbitrary, anti-White court ruling. Commander Koehl pointed out that "the Governor has no plans to stop this or any act of Federal tyranny."

7 March The Commander and Mr. Kirstein arrived at the Los Angeles Headquarters and conferred with Party Members and Supporters. On the ninth, he visited Rio Hondo College to present the students with the message of National Socialism and offer them an alternative to the nonsense offered up by the present liberal System. Speaking to the several hundred students in attendance, Commander Koehl proclaimed, "National Socialism is the way of the future". The appearance rapidly turned into a confrontation with the many anti-White Chicanos and leftists, but the Commander dominated the situation in spite of the opposition. 10 March The Commander was interviewed by a reporter from the Los Angeles Free Press, a liberal youth-oriented paper. The resulting article, shown below, is the result of that interview. The Free Press is the largest selling weekly in the country.

'WHITE IS WONDERFUL' New American Nazi leader pleased with hate in L.A.

It was 2:45 P.M. as I entered the dingy headquarters of the National Socialist White People's Party in El Monte. Real live Nazis were milling around in T-shirts and jeans. One of them, Lt. Joe Tommasi, approached me and explained the reason for this pervasive odor of paint — white of course. "Well, since we own this building now (they acquired it in January from realtor Sherwood Jackson — yes, he's Jewish) we thought we'd perk it up."

Actually, the fresh paint and the gaudy spreads that covered the living room chairs and the cheap simulated brick wallpaper freshly glued on the kitchen walls were conceived in honor of Commander Matt Koehl. Koehl was gracing the El Monte headquarters with his presence for a few days.

Koehl is hailed by his followers as "the third greatest man in the history of the world" — after Adolf Hitler and George Lincoln Rockwell. He had seen America first on this journey to California, traveling by car the 3,000 miles from the national headquarters in Arlington, Va. He was rightly tickered out and had been limiting his time here to "high-level" talks. He had found time, however, to spread the word to students at Rio Hondo Junior College the day before.

I was seated in the newly enlarged meeting room that was empty but for six buzzing flies. In a few minutes Herr Commander entered.

What I saw was a man who had stepped right out of 1960 — five feet 10 inches, slender and unassuming, dressed in a puke olive green suit with narrow lapels, a narrow black tie, close-cropped and slicked down brown hair, finely clipped moustache. His bellowing "Heil!" and wide grin seemed to indicate he had found his best friend rather than an interviewer.

Koehl said he has reason to smile. "I'm happy as a lark about all the publicity we've received here," he chuckled as he set very properly in a folding chair with arms folded. "I think Joe Tommasi has done a fantastic job. If I had a Joe Tommasi in every major city this revolution would be half won!"

Koehl pledges a revolution, regis-

tered within the next ten to fifteen years — the form it takes is the only question. "We're moving racially, economically and politically in that direction. But the time is not right yet. People are too comfortable. When their jobs and security are threatened they will begin to look toward our alternative — a white man's revolution. It's a glorious future we have in store!"

Koehl figures that by 1990 the Nazis will be able to replace the George Wallace movement. He says Wallace offers no real choice now and is Tweedle Dee in a Tweedle Dum election campaign. But for now, the Nazis' objective is to add on to their ten headquarters around the country enough people to total what Koehl

estimated with a straight face at between ten and twenty million public and secret supporters. (The young-and-don't-know-better Tommasi blabbed that there are only 2,000 honest-to-goodness Nazis in the United States.)

Koehl received his leadership training as a door-to-door encyclopedia salesman and hardhat. He was born 37 years ago in Milwaukee, Wis., during "the middle of the Roosevelt depression" that left his father unemployed. "I grew up being taught to hate national socialism, to hate Adolf Hitler. I was taught the equality of the races. I was being brainwashed like everyone else."

"I think one of the things that at-

Lawsuit challenges school wiretapping

"A climate of fear and suspicion has existed in this district for a number of years, they have been confirmed by the evidence which has been collected to document the charges the Guild has made."

This remark by Dr. Arthur Fletcher, president of the American Federation of Teachers College Guild, set the tone for a Monday afternoon press conference called by representatives of the AFT, and attorneys from the Legal Aid Foundation of Los Angeles, the Western Center on Law and Poverty, and the American Civil Liberties Union.

The immediate issue was the continued use of electronic surveillance equipment at L.A. Community Colleges (See March 10 Free Press which accented the daily press on this story by two weeks). Earlier in the day, the AFT, together with the three legal associations, filed suit against the L.A. Community College District.

The suit requests that the courts issue a temporary restraining order, a temporary injunction and a permanent injunction barring college administrators from the further use of electronic surveillance devices.

Also listed as co-plaintiffs in the action are three students and an instructor from L.A.C.C., Southwest College, Valley College and L.A. Trade Tech. The students and the instructor are filing on behalf of all other students and faculty members at the various colleges.

Punitive damages of \$1 million are being asked for the injury and harm done to campus personnel from the surveillance. General damages of \$3,000 for each individual plaintiff is also sought.

As yet, no one has been able to determine exactly how widespread the use of electronic devices are at the colleges. However, new evidence has surfaced which indicates that the practice is more extensive than originally thought.

On March 9, the chief of campus security at Trade Tech, Harold Cole, signed an affidavit listing his personal experiences with surveillance as he was previously employed. Cole states that on one occasion he observed a recording device inside the campus security office at Trade Tech which was used to tape conversations between campus police

tracted me to national socialism was the vehemence of the campaign against it. I began to look for something written on the other side. I read Mein Kampf chapter by chapter. I could see the book was true."

Koehl attended the University of Wisconsin for two years and then joined the Marine Corps. He involved himself in racist organizations upon his discharge. He joined the Nazis in 1960, one year after it was founded by Rockwell. When Rockwell was killed by an assassin's bullet in a Virginia Shopping center in 1967, Koehl, then party secretary, assumed Nazi leadership.

"As long as there is an alien Jewish structure and a huge black presence we cannot concern ourselves with other problems," Koehl continued. As for the blacks, Herr Commander feels that since the whites brought the blacks here against their will it is only nice and proper that it be the whites who take them back. "This is basically a white man's society," he said. "We can never force blacks to accept white standards. So they have to go. Boiling them back into Africa is the only means by which to prevent a holocaust in America."

The Nazis consider the Jews a "stickler" problem. Unlike the blacks, he says, they are "intruders." "If the Jews would get out of our hair there would be no problem. But they have a predominant influence in government, mass communications and the economy. Their influence is disproportionate to their numbers."

Perhaps we could find some place on this earth's surface — maybe an island — where we could put them all. And then we could get a big international navy to make sure they behave themselves. This is all we want."

I had been suspicious. Koehl had talked too calmly, too carefully. He hadn't used one "nigger," one "kike." He seemed to be on his best behavior. So I decided to observe him in a more revealing setting — at the special Nazi meeting the next night in the same room.

This meeting was considered the social highlight of the year for the El Monte headquarters. Nazis from as far south as San Diego and as far north as Seattle had come. A 16mm projector had been rented to screen Hitler's Triumph of the Will.

Lt. Tommasi, a natural ham at 21, shouted Nazi rhetoric. "You people aren't here because you want coffee and cookies! You're here to start a revolution! We will win! You're going to be a part of it! Heil Hitler!"

Koehl had a tough act to follow. The bulky Tommasi had turned the audience into a salivating, shouting horde. But Herr Commander was not to disappoint. Standing with his chin buried in his chest to summon his deepest baritone rumble, the frail-looking leader began.

"Against all the hate, national socialism continues to burn. (Loud applause.) That's because national socialism embodies everything decent... (loud applause) good... (loud applause, shouts) and holy on this earth (thunderous applause, shouts, foot-stamping, saluting!)"

"In North Carolina some fellow blew up a school that had started busing. Then they moved the coons to another school (laughter). Then he blew that one up (Loud laughter). Then they moved the pickeninnies to a third school and he did his thing there. (Howling laughter.) At least his heart was in the right place! (Howling laughter, applause, shouts, foot-stamping, saluting!)"

"If these creeps in Washington say that busing is the law of the land then I say it's time for some killing! (Standing ovation, shouts, salutes!)"

"The white majority is facing an identity crisis. It's bigotry to talk about white power these days, but not black power or brown power. (Shouts of agreement.) We must learn to think of each other as white brothers and sisters. If every white person knew how the other white person felt there would be a revolution in two weeks! (Shouts of applause, foot-stamping.) Write is wonderful!" (Standing ovation, shouts, salutes.)

In their frenzy the crowd contributed very generously into the Wehrmacht helmet that was passed amongst them. "We want the Commander to travel home in comfort," said Tommasi.

"Hail the Commander great!" a 65-year-old uniformed Nazi said to me as he fished a couple bucks from his wallet. "He's in tune with the problems. He's gonna save us."

11 March Commander Koehl addressed a meeting of local Party Members and Supporters in the Los Angeles Headquarters. The meeting was attended by a record 120 Party people. During the meeting there were numerous ST swear-ins. A special awards ceremony was held during which the following awards were presented for action during the recent, abortive attack on the L.A. Headquarters. Medal of Merit: David Bletcher (also received Wound Medal), Phil Christman, William Domask, John Ernst, Mike Falkenberg, William Kirstein, Paul Raymond, Wayne Raymond, Robert Schloegl, Dan Stewart, Doug Swigart, Warren Teter, Joseph Tommasi, Dan Webster and Steve Westfall.

William Kirstein, Lt. Joe Tommasi and Robert Homan, who recently returned from a tour of duty in Viet Nam also spoke to the assembly.

12 March Commander Koehl gave radio and newspaper interviews and inspected the Party's new bookstore in San Diego. He discussed the Movement's future developments in that area with Group Leader Gerald Smith and San Diego activists. Publicity resulting from a local newspaper interview is shown below.

13 March Students from Monrovia High School met with and talked to Commander Koehl about the problem of increasing Black terrorism in their school. The Commander gave them some pointers on White self-defense which were put to good use during an outbreak of Black violence at the school the following day.

16 March The Commander appeared on Sacramento KQOR TV's "Call 13" show. The program was conducted very successfully. Many of the local residents calling the audience-participation program showed interest in the National Socialist movement. Later on, the Commander appeared on the same station's news program. There were interviews with newspapers of Tracy and Stockton, Calif., and on the 17th, an interview with a Modesto paper. One such interview that appeared in the Stockton Record is reproduced at the top of the following page.

19 March Commander Koehl and Mr. Kirstein met with a group of Phoenix, Ariz., idealists who had earlier formed their own group called the "American Nazi Party" but have now joined the NSWPP, recognizing it as the sole standard bearer of Adolf Hitler's and Lincoln Rockwell's National Socialist movement.

21 March The Commander returned to Alabama, this time visiting Tuscaloosa and a number of University of Alabama students who have had it with restrictions on pro-White activities while militant Blacks get free rein in Wallace country.

23 March Again in North Carolina, the Commander met with local people at a showing of the always popular "Triumph of the Will."

25 March After arriving at National Headquarters in Arlington, Commander Koehl and 10 Party Members and Supporters went to York, Pa., to attend a meeting of interested Whites in that area.

Hitler's Nazis on rise again-in La Mesa

The Nazi party has once again emerged from the woodwork. National Commander Matt Koehl, in San Diego last weekend to chair a local chapter meeting, estimates that if his party had the financial resources and organizational wherewithal, it could influence the outcome of the Presidential election. Among the National Socialist White Peoples Party's diffuse and confusing ideological planks are environmental conservation and rejection of the two-party system—ideas that even the Peace & Freedom Party can embrace. The legacies of Adolph Hitler, whose picture solemnly hangs on a wall in the chapter meeting hall at 720 University Ave., hold the line against school busing and still wage a vigilant cold war

against Communist bloc nations—approaches entirely acceptable to, for instance, the American Independent Party. But within those relatively encompassing parameters the similarities to the spectrum of political persuasions and rather noticeably for the Nazi Party. It is an organization founded upon delusions, oblivious to contradictions, and fueled by deep-rooted paranoia. Essential prerequisites to membership are a calculated ability to dismiss claims of German atrocities during World War II and an abiding fervor in the supremacy of a white, Aryan culture.

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It is past noon on Sunday, and local party chairman Lt. Gerald K. Smith is explaining that Commander Koehl has

been inexplicably detained, but will arrive shortly. A curious crowd has formed in the lobby of the group's headquarters: newsmen, skeptical longhairs, and uniformed stern troopers gathered for the chapter meeting that will follow a press conference. A bespectacled young woman—perhaps a member's wife—sits in a chair in the corner bottle-feeding her tiny infant. Smith is on the phone arranging for the delivery of more chairs to seat the assemblage, fielding the gently probing queries of two teenage boys. Was it a mistake for the U.S. to have fought Nazi Germany in World War II? "Absolutely. The only nation that came away a winner was Soviet Union." The younger party members await the arrival of the national figurehead with an

expectant anxiety, drawing deeply on uncertainly posed cigarettes and idly straightening piles of party literature on the counter which divides the spare office. Outfitted in black jeans spit-shined, low-quarter oxfords, and shoulder-flapped khaki shirts adorned by insignia, marksmanship medals, and red-bordered swastika armbands, the

troopers peel off their green fatigue field jackets, emblazoned with the stars-and-stripes, the stars-and-bars, skull-and-crossbones, and, of course, swastikas. Smith is an ex-marine and many are military veterans—perhaps demolition experts, or former M.I. Out of uniform and in a crowd of their peers, their close-cropped hair and

well-heavened jaws would make them stand out markedly. Presenting a striking contrast to "the other five per cent" of young Americans categorized as a "troublemaker," the troopers maintain a respectful silence in the presence of their superiors, who apparently will do the talking. Presently, Commander Koehl arrives, a dark, wiry man of medium height whose black hair is trimmed to an austere Prussian length. He wears the familiar brush-style moustache of a diminutive demagogue of 40 years past; his brown eyes dartingly survey the scene, attempting to discern the newsmen in the crowd. He is anxious to get on with the interview session. As I am joined by a reporter carrying a portable cassette tape recorder, the remainder

of the crowd intently moves forward to the edge of the counter. Obviously, it is more than a press conference; it is an educational lecture for the benefit of party solidarity and morale. ++++ I capture the acknowledged American Führer on film, the radio man begins questioning Koehl in a stiff, deliberate fashion. Koehl's answers are essentially tremulous, yet he is quick in replying. Although never groping for words, he falters slightly when unable to summon a pat, bureaucratic response.

Koehl vouchsafes that the party intends to involve itself in the GOP Convention this summer—to what extent, and how many, he isn't prepared to disclose. "We're in the planning stages," he allows.

What is the party's national membership? "Here again, this is something we don't disclose." It is on the rise, however, especially within the past year. Koehl surmises that it is the fear of reprisals and social pressures which prevents prospective members from "coming right out and wearing an armband." The party's primary objective is the attainment of "white power," the Führer affirms. "We want to make this a white America—an America which fulfills the purpose of the founding fathers in setting up this nation in the first place."

The radio man leads him further. Who do they regard as their principal opponent? "The most likely to try to stop us would be organized Jewry," says Koehl, with little hesitation. "There is a Jewish power structure in this country," he explains slowly, "which is using the blacks and other racial minorities against the interest of the white people."

As for the blacks, Koehl expansively favors "repatriation of the blacks back to their ancestral homeland in Africa," which would be "more feasible, more practical, and in time—less expensive than the cost of maintaining the blacks here as it does now." Thus far the questioning has been tepid, devoid of philosophical import. I decide to wade into the breach. "Commander, do you feel that the idea of minority repatriation is justifiable when the only race or culture indigenous to this continent is the American Indian?" Koehl blinks in surprise. "I don't believe," he begins slowly, "that this is essentially a white man's country." He is starting to let stride, and I can sense that rhetoric

but rehearsed, pat answers are forthcoming. "Before the coming of the first Europeans, he continues, 'the concept of America didn't exist—as a nation or a geographic idea. In our opinion, the white man, the first Europeans that came here—are the first Americans.'"

His syntax is beginning to betray his self-assurance. How does he reconcile the constitutional notion that all men are created equal? "The founding fathers who drew up the original constitution—many of them owned slaves. When they made references to equality, they were not

hammer is the symbol of our race," he delineates. "We are Americans; we are also white men. So there is nothing incongruous or inconsistent with our using the swastika."

It is evident that he will gag on no question—where inconsistencies occur, they will be ignored. When facts will not stack up, he simply reshuffles them.

"Our socialism is an applied love for our own race," Koehl points out in reference to the party's official title. "It has nothing to do with nationalizing somebody's business or things like that." Pressing for an opening, I

who urge U.S. involvement on behalf of Israel. Apparently, Koehl has been boning up on Joseph Alsop.

"If you find political means inexpedient or unsuccessful, would you turn to an armed overthrow of the government to assume control?" I bait him. "Let me make our position very clear," he prefaces in an all-too-familiar refrain, "one way or another, the white race in this country is going to survive. Nothing will destroy it."

Without getting down to specifics, he all but lets the cat out of the bag. "Whatever it takes to achieve this—whatever is necessary—will be done." White man uber alles? He explains further.

"We are faced today with a situation—a threat of genocide... integration, busing, these are just fancy terms for genocide against the white race. It doesn't make any difference whether our race is destroyed through racial stimulation or whether they line all of our people up and mow them down with machine guns—the effect is all the same."

"So you see the survival of the white race as superseding the dictates of the Constitution?" I suggest. "There is a higher law in this universe," Koehl answers loftily, "and that is survival. The law of survival is the first law." This statement opens an interesting door.

"Would that right extend to other races, such as the ones that suffered genocide in World War II?" I inquire delicately. Taken aback, Koehl maneuvers shrewdly to regain his dialectic footing. "Of course, I dispute the allegations of genocide that have been applied to the German National Socialists—this was the product of wartime propaganda," he replies matter-of-factly.

"Well, it depends on what those figures are," he says hastily. "If they are grossly inflated, I most certainly would dispute them." "The highest figures have placed the number at six million," I offer. "That's ridiculous," he snaps irritably. "Talk about a credibility gap!" Koehl sounds almost offended at the thought.

At this point, the crowd, which had been nodding in agreement with their Führer's remarks, comes alive with a round of knowing laughter. Apparently, this is a case of consistency being laid to rest among the party's seceders. Their circuitous newswpeak has deleted all mention of atrocities in

another day and age. "That's impossible... it's preposterous," Koehl concludes firmly. The lid to Pandora's box, which had momentarily yawned open, closes shut once again.

All told, the KQOR reporter and I must have quizzed Koehl shrewdly for some 30 minutes. His answers were uniformly undefensive, emanating from a peculiar self-righteousness which admits to no moral wrongdoing. At times, his logic waxed unassailable, were it not for the undeniable nature of his underlying premises.

Koehl's frequent lapses into pettifoggery punctuated his rambling explanations of the party's ideological nuances, achieving an overall effect of puzzling obfuscation.


I was disappointed to learn that he had not "had time to read" the memoirs of Albert Speer, "Inside the Third Reich." For the successor to George Lincoln Rockwell, such a failure looms as a cardinal sin of omission in his mental preparedness.

"I wouldn't take anything Albert Speer might have said as authentic," he cautioned, referring to the "circumstances under which the book was written" and "certain modifications" that were made "to suit the requirements of the publisher."

The commander was also unaware of the postwar roles of former SS agents as spies in the employ of the CIA, outlined by Henri Hoehne and Hermann Goerring in "The General Was a Spy."

When we concluded the session, the assembled multitudes rewarded Koehl with an appreciative snattering of applause. The party had listened enraptured throughout the interview, and appeared satisfied that what needed saying was simply said. Koehl relaxed the intensity he brought to bear so relentlessly under questioning, circulating among the group and shaking hands with the aploids of a politician.

The impression which persists after a hypocritically polemical encounter with Koehl is that if this is the philosophical standard—bearer of the "1st party," they have a tough road to hoe before they become a force to contend with.

Nazi Brings 'White America' Hopes to S J.

Matt Koehl, commander of the National Socialist White People's Party, brought his hopes for "a white America" to the Stockton-Tracy area this past week.

He visited supporters in Tracy Thursday and Friday, and spoke at an unheralded outdoor gathering on the Delta College campus in Stockton Friday afternoon.

Koehl was following in the footsteps of the previous furher of the American Nazis, the late George Lincoln Rockwell. He visited Tracy several times before he was shot to death near the National Socialist headquarters in Virginia several years ago.

Purpose of his visit to Tracy, Koehl said, was "to explore the possibilities of white power in Tracy and this area."

His adherents claim responsibility for painting the swastika emblem of Adolph Hitler's Nazi Germany in public places throughout the Tracy area in recent months.

Koehl called for a "spiritual revolution" and "a new spirit and attitude" he said National Socialism will bring to the United States and the other "white" nations of the world.

Membership doubled in his party last year, said Koehl, who believes his group will gain political control of this country in the late 1980's, "eventually replacing Wallace."

The National Socialists plan to "smash the Jewish power structure" (he claims all three major TV networks and many large newspapers and newspaper chains, and magazine and book publishers are controlled by Jewish interests), and send all blacks to Africa.

"Instead of busing, what we want is busing," said Koehl, who declared that removing blacks from the United States is a first step to solving problems here.

He said he might also favor sending to Mexico many Mexican-Americans who are not descended from those of preterritory days.

He said National Socialists also would stop importation of "cheap labor" from nonwhite countries.

Koehl said his party supports free enterprise "for the little guys," breaking up conglomerates and monopolies, moving 25 per cent of the people "black to the land" on small family farms and co-operatives, and reducing taxes by eliminating "black welfare programs."

They favor providing houses and low-cost loans for citizens, instituting and applying capital

punishments and having "public executions," and streamlining the Constitution by providing some representation based on occupations instead of all by geography... and other issues such as eliminating pollution and retaining citizens' rights to bear arms.

MAJOR GOAL

Stamping out communism is one of the major goals of his party, said Koehl, who recommends "work therapy" to curb Communist political leanings.

"It's essentially white men's country, with a white majority, white people built it and white people ought to run it," said Koehl.

Robert Homan Speaks in Vancouver

Robert Homan, prominent National Socialist activist and former staff member, delivered an address to a meeting of interested Whites in Vancouver, B.C. Party Supporters James Friesan and George Magas also spoke at the gathering. Two days later, Mr. Homan appeared on Ed Murphey's "Open Line" radio program on CKWX. During the three-hour program the listeners reacted responsively to Mr. Homan's presentation of the National Socialist program and ideology. He also spoke to a social studies class in Seattle's Franklin High.

Other events in the Seattle-Vancouver area recently have included a National Socialist counter-demonstration against about 100 leftists who demanded freedom for Black Communist Angela Davis. On April 1, six Stormtroopers confronted the mass of creeps in front of the Seattle Federal Court House. The event received excellent coverage on local TV.
