Adolf Hitler's Birthday Commemorated Across Nation

15 April — Members and supporters from the Seattle-Vancouver, B.C. area met in Seattle to honor the Leader's 83rd birthday. Speakers, including Mr. Robert Homan and Mr. George Magas, spoke on Adolf Hitler's life and the development of the National Socialist world-view, the origin and meaning of the Swastika and local activities for the area. After a solemn ceremony honoring National Socialist martyrs, there was a film showing of the El Monte-JDL confrontation of 30 January (see NS Bulletin number 103).

The commemoration, held in a Seattle hotel, was attended by a goodly number of area Whites.

22 April — Although day-long heavy rainfall forced cancellation of the planned rally in Washington, D.C., members and supporters from the Eastern Seaboard enjoyed an indoor celebration which included appropriate ceremony, the swearing-in of ST members, and a showing of "Triumph of the Will." Commander Matt Koehl addressed the assembly on the significance of Adolf Hitler's mission, saying that the dawn of a new age was signaled by the birth of this one man. Quoting National Socialist writer Savitri Devi, the Commander concluded that the National Socialist philosophy not only surpasses Aryan man today, but all mankind in all epochs, for it ultimately expresses the primordial wisdom of the cosmos. "It was to Adolf Hitler's glory," he continued, "to reintroduce this divine wisdom to a world on the brink of catastrophe."

22 April — Ten teams of ST from the Los Angeles headquarters interrupted a 5000-creep treason march that featured Rev. Ralph Abernathy as a speaker. The troops took and held the Reds' planned assembly area in MacArthur Park on Wilshire Blvd. Hose-nosed warriors of the "anti-Communist" Jewish Defense League teamed up with the Reds first to harass, then attack our men. They were successfully beaten back by the ST. One JDLer was severely beaten during the fight and five were later arrested by police. One ST man was also arrested. A news clipping about the incident is at the top of the next page, though it does lack accuracy.

Demonstrators renew protests

Antiwar demonstrators by the tens of thousands turned out for rallies in major cities and several state capitols Saturday, the sixth straight day of protests against renewed United States bombing of North Vietnam.

More than 50,000 demonstrators marched two miles in pouring rain through the heart of Manhattan, carrying umbrellas along with their picket signs. Mayor John Lindsay issued a statement saying, "I loin all Americans who on April 22 will speak out for peace."

Former Beaue John Lennon and his wife Yoko Ono were among the celebrities leading the demonstrators in the Len-

non song, "Give Peace a Chance."

More than 30,000 persons theo into San Francisco's Kezar Stadium to hear speeches by actress Jane Fonda, black comedian Dick Gregory and Panther Leader Bobby Seare, then enjoyed thee temonate and a chance to introv darts at an image of President Nixon.

IN CHICAGO, chill winds blew as 2000 marched from the Civic Center Plaza to Grant Park. A group of 25 broke away toward the Conrad Hilton Hotel, scene of one of the worst clashes between protesters and police during the 1968 Democratic Convention, but police made them move on. One woman refused and was arrested.

Marchers moved 30 abreast along Wilshipe Boulevard in Los Angeles. There was a tense nament when three dozen members of the Jewish Detense amagic taking part in the

march were confronted by 30 brown-shirted American Nazis

Vietnam Veterans Against the War bore a flag-draped Casket, symbolic of all those who died in Indechina, through the rain of Washington, D.C., to the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier Saturday. The veterans then laid a memorial wreath and

carried the casket to the Pentagon.

About 200 protesters staged an all-night sit-in at the University of Illinois student union at Urbana before leaving for Saturday's rally in Chicago. Students at Princeton University in New Jersey ended their sit-in at the Woodrow Wilson School for Public and International Affairs at 3 a.m. after 12 hours.

RUNNING BATTLES between police and demonstrators at the University of Texas-Austin compus ended shortly before dawn with at least 15 arrests. As many as 2000 students tried to occupy the University's main building and stoned the Lyondon B. Johnson Memorial Library.

In many cities, police faced their sixth straight day of confrontation with protestors.

"Uptight" Leaflet Gets Niggers, Liberals Uptight


Young activists in Upper New York state high schools have found the "Uptight About School?" leaflet a good way of getting the message across to their fellow Whites. At one school, the leaflets have prompted Whites to stick together amid Black violence and terrorism, and then to effectively oppose it. The majority of White students agreed with the leaflet and united to protect themselves from the rampaging Blacks, something, needless to say, that the liberal school administrators would not tolerate. While allowing Black violence on the one hand, these anti-White types stifle any expression of White self-defense and solidarity on the other. By doing so, they expose their free speech hypocrisy and further alienate themselves from disaffected young Whites. They are the first to forget about their "free speech" ideals when confronted by Whites demanding their rights. Notes From NS Publications

- 1) It has long been Party policy that only members are entitled to receive free subscriptions to the WHITE POWER newspaper. Official supporters must have a subscription to receive copies regularly.
