City Officials Fail to Close Baltimore HQ!

The new Baltimore headquarters, as was mentioned in Bulletin No. 118, has been under a literal siege by anti-NS elements in the city. The difficult task of protecting the building on Eastern Avenue and defending themselves was made no easier for our comrades by the police and city authorities.

A pattern developed which made it clear that any response by the local police to an attack upon the Party building would be both slow and unproductive. Despite the fact that the building was attacked by groups of anti-White wretches several times a night during the last week of August and into early September, the police made no arrests against the assailants.

Instead, whenever National Socialists responded to physical attacks against themselves and the Baltimore headquarters, the police arrested them, despite the fact that they were responding in self-defense. The building was the target of continuous bottle- and rock-throwing (at one point a chair was hurled against the front window), molotov cocktails, and explosive devices. The growing lack of cooperation by the local authorities made it evident that they were condoning the violence in the hope of forcing the Baltimore headquarters to close down.

On the evening of 31 August, five Party comrades were arrested by the police in the midst of an assault on the front of the Party building by anti-Party elements. Our men were charged with assault. Several of the men had received injuries from the rock- and bottle-throwing mob. None of the mob was arrested.

Things have calmed down now. Baltimore headquarters has been recruiting increasing numbers of new adherents and many new Official Supporters have been signed up. Invitations have been received from several high schools requesting Party speakers. Both the public and the city authorities now recognize the fact that the Party is in Baltimore to stay.

But the Party had to pay a price. Five men are going to trial on 6 October for defending themselves and Party property. They were going the job that the police were supposed to do but deliberately neglected. Four of the five men are on \$500 bond; the fifth is on \$1,000 bond and is falsely charged with brandishing a rifle. Charged with assault they face up to 20 years imprisonment. We know that we can win this case, if we have your support. It is critical that we do win, not only for the sake of the five comrades who face a possible jail term in one of the worst nigger prisons in the country, but also for the Party. The city authorities, having failed to drive us out physically, are now resorting to kangaroo courts.

The Party can defeat the charges against our five men if it has recourse to good legal counsel. This means money. The Party is already contesting an anti-Swastika statute in Miami Beach in which Commander Koehl is facing a \$500 fine and up to 90 days in jail. The Commander is presently out on \$1000 bond. In order to give these five dedicated comrades the type of legal counsel they deserve could require thousands of dollars. They deserve your support. They stood by the Party in its time of need; now we must stand by them.

A special Legal Aid Fund has been established to assist the Party in its court fights. As the Movement asserts itself increased court battles are inevitable. The five National Socialists now fighting for their freedom in Baltimore are counting on your financial support to help them win their cases.

Nazi Potential In Broward: Just Hot Air?

'Storm Troopers' On March But The Ranks Are Thin

The potential for growth of Nazi activism in the Broward County area may be "limited."

If that's not good news to you, it sure is to Matt Koehl and Robert Homan — the number one and number two men respectively in the American National Socialist White People's Party (better known as the Nazi Party).

"Limitless," though, means no more than "handfuls" in today's scaled-down Nazi reality. At present, it's estimated there are no more than "three to four dozen" members of the party in the county, according to Homan's estimate.

Already, claims national party secretary Homan, Broward County is one of the four "major areas" of Nazi strength in Florida.

National party director Koehl adds that Broward is at present behind the other three areas — Jacksonville, Tampa and Orlando — but "in terms of potential, it (Broward) is second to none," the Nazi leader said happily.

"With the potential we have here, we will find the Dade-Broward area our primary source," Koehl predicted.

The Nazis, although they speak in the most militant of terms in their newsletters and recorded telephone messages (Broward is due to get a dial-a-Nazi message within six months, Homan said) do not present a law enforcement problem in Broward, said Sheriff Ed Stack.

"A couple of times they had meetings here," Stack recalled. "It was all a lot of hot air more than anything else."

Stack said the meetings occurred about one and one-half years ago. At that time, his men took down the license numbers of the cars of those attending the meeting, but the sheriff said since then there has been no law enforcement problems with the Nazis.

But several weeks ago, a Broward resident was astonished to see a group of four completely uniformed storm troopers parading down State Road 7 toward Davis Boulevard, carrying a Nazi flag.

That same day, two other local residents called The News and asked why they had been seeing roadside signs with swastika posters and the Nazi slogan — "White Power" — on them.

To cap it all off, that night the Fort Lauderdale Police Department dispatcher was heard over the police radio dispatching a car to the Sears Town shopping center at the intersection of Federal Highway and Sunrise Boulevard to check for storm troopers.



What makes a Broward County man decide to become a Nazi?

A local Nazi activist says, "More people are seeing this as an all-action group. For example, he explained, "any time we see a Viet Cong flag or a Communist flag, it is ripped down and the person holding it is punched out."

The activist also said he believes tax money from white taxpayers is going to fund black protest groups, and he feels this is driving many whites into the anxious arms of his fellow Nazis.

Koehl, national party director, says the "tremendous potential" that he sees in the Broward-Dade County area is due in part to the proximity of Miami Beach with its large Jewish population and in part to the racial situation in south Florida "that just doesn't exist elsewhere."

"Here in Florida, you have a very recognizable Jewish problem," he added.

The Nazi movement here as well as elsewhere in the country appeals mostly to the young, claimed the local Nazi activist, 27.

He said most people in the Broward group are about the same age as he is.

Some Nazis are reluctant to openly disclose their membership in the party, although others feel so strongly in favor of the cause they even buy a storm trooper uniform — brown shirt, black pants, combat boots, party pin and swastika armband — to try to stir fear into the hearts of all non-white non-Aryans in America.

The local Nazi activist agreed to talk to The News only on the condition his name not be mentioned in the story.

"If my name gets known, I'll know who did it," he warned a reporter.

The Nazi would not let his name be mentioned for fear his parents, who live in this area, would get obscene telephone calls.

Florida National Socialists Expand Activities

Neo-Nazis, neighbors clash at new office

A normally placid East Baltimore neighborhood was disrupted by a week of brief but bitter clashes between the residents and the members of the National Socialist White People's Party.

The trouble began last Saturday, when members of the neo-Nazi white people's party opened a Baltimore headquarters in the 100 block Eastern avenue and placed a large red swastika banner between an American flag and a Maryland flag.

When one of the party members reportedly came out and began shouting that his organization was for "white power" and against "Jews, niggers and polacks," the residents reacted angrily.

More than 500 members of the party, many of them in neighborhood gathered in small knots and began shouting taunts at party members. One elderly veteran who had been wounded in World War II particularly objected to the "swastika and allegedly three in one" of a young party member.

In making accusations against each other and in defending their actions, both camps have fallen back on their rights as citizens.

There have been violent attacks against people in this organization as well as the property here. There has been an assault with a pistol, as seen on the news.

Four men described by police as members of a neo-Nazi organization were arrested early today on the roof of the organization's East Baltimore headquarters after allegedly hurling bottles at a crowd on the street below.

The disturbance erupted about an hour after police picked up another organization member who was accused of menacing two neighborhood women with a rifle Wednesday night.

Window smashed

Verbal insults were exchanged, and a chair was thrown through the front window of the headquarters.

The confrontation continued every evening this week with small groups of neighborhood residents gathering at dusk and staying until the early hours of the morning, keeping the party headquarters in a virtual state of siege.

Several times each night the tension reached a point where the combatants stopped hurling insults and began throwing missiles.

results physically on people, firebombing, windows broken, general disorder in the streets. These are facts," Mr. Schadt continued.

To clarify the rights of his organization, Mr. Schadt asked the Baltimore chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union to make a statement on the case.

John Roemer, 31, the executive director of the union in Maryland, said in an interview: "Mr. Schadt and any controversial person has the right to hand out his material, run for office and hold office."

he answer to this statement, one of the residents hoisted: "They're Nazis, but they hide behind the U.S. Constitution."

"What about our rights? We don't have to be bothered by them," several neighbors shouted.

In answer to Mr. Schadt's charges of harassment, neighbors claimed they had been provoked by members of the party.

Clare Milwicz, whose second-floor apartment is across from the roof of the party headquarters, maintained that earlier this week she looked out her bedroom window and saw a party member pointing a weapon at her.

Later, police arrested Edward Watson, 19, of the 7100 block Eastern avenue, and charged him with assault by pointing a pistol in that incident.

Other neighbors have complained of being doosed with noise and hit by bottles thrown by party members. Thursday night, four men were taken from the roof of the party building by assault and charged with assault by throwing bottles.

Cassy Junior, another neighbor, said that what irked him most was the "strange way these guys come out and stare at you. They just stand there and look and don't say anything. It's unnerving."

But another resident, Tony Olesinski, 18, of the 500 block Eastern avenue, said:

"The leader states that the party needs 'a government for the people' not for traitors, race mixers and selfish politicians. For the good education and the teaching of honesty, morality and strength of character to our youth: a strong and free America."

The party is opposed to "race mixing, drugs and disgusting hippieism; integration, black power and both sides; higher taxes and sugar warfare."

When asked how many members his organization has, Mr. Schadt replied, "That is not to be disclosed."

Starting out from their nest, marble-stopped houses onto the street littered with broken glass, many area residents are asking about "why our neighborhood is being terrorized."

But Mr. Schadt had a suggestion: "They should take steps to prevent violent acts rather than responding after the violent acts have occurred."

Police in the middle Thus the two groups stand uncomfortably face to face, both with good constitutional arguments. All that separates them from actual warfare, they say, is the police.

"We're in the middle. We don't take sides. We're trying to preserve the peace and protect the lives and property on both sides," Capt. Simon J. Avera, of the Southeastern district, said.

Alternately jeered and cheered by the hostile groups, police officers have responded to trouble at the party headquarters as often as four times in five hours.

The leaflet gave a Bridgeport address for the National Socialist White People's Party. Bridgeport is the New England headquarters for the group.

"Stand with us before the altar of Adolph Hitler and the world conquering white race and pledge your life, as we have to, to bring the order and justice of the Western White Civilization once more into the world," the leaflet said.

Police Chief Edward Slezak said the department learned of the leaflet only this morning and "definitely" intended to look into the matter.
