Commander Tours Midwest

During the first two weeks of February the Commander went on an extensive tour of the Midwest.

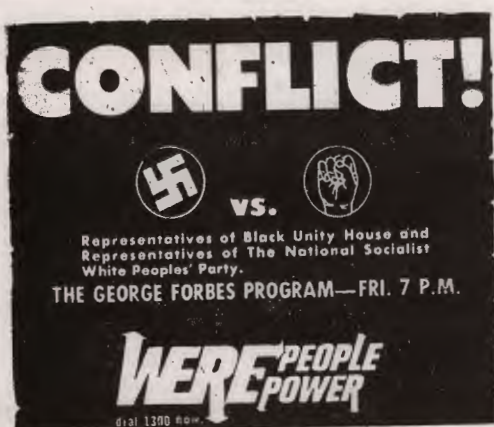
On 1 February he was a guest on WERE radio in Cleveland, a CBS affiliate. The "host" was George L. Forbes, a Black on the Cleveland City Council. Two other Blacks, "Brother Diablo" and Eddie Collier, from a Black nationalist organization called the "Black Unity House," also participated in the three and one-half hour call-in show.

The Blacks were somewhat shocked at first when the Commander appeared in the studio wearing an armband and did not apologize when they called him a "racist." Before long, they found themselves begrudgingly agreeing with the Party's policy of Black repatriation to Africa. Expecting to put the Commander on the defensive with their moans of "400 years of slavery," ad nauseam, they quickly found themselves on the receiving end.

On 2 February the Commander spoke before an audience at Cuyahoga Community College near Akron, Ohio. He discussed the racial, philosophical, and psychological aspects of National Socialism and compared them with the puerile, anti-Hitler propaganda that they were being given as "history." He contrasted the pan-Aryan racial idealism of National Socialism with Communism's state tyranny and liberal-democracy's tyranny of the individual.

The Commander appeared on the "Soul Searchers" program on WKBF-TV, Channel 61, in Cleveland on 11 February. The Party's repatriation program, the Lincoln Plan, was the topic of discussion.

At a Party meeting held in Chicago on 11 February, the Commander discussed the action-politics of National Socialism and the importance of "raising the banner." "This dynamism is what makes the Party unique," he explained, "and is a fundamental prerequisite for victory." Petitions won't do it; Birch-type meetings won't do it; and "sneaking politics" won't do it. "The 'meet, eat, and retreat' mentality is incompatible with the spirit of the NSWPP," he declared. He pointed out Lincoln Rockwell's disgust with such elements and warnings to them that sneaking doesn't work and is only a substitute for action.

Buffalo Activists Cause Jewish Panic

Things continue to ferment in Buffalo, N.Y., where Party activists have sparked general alarm in Jewish-leftist circles by their bold appearance in their very midst.

After the National Socialist picket last month (see 1 February Bulletin) and some follow-up activities, including much publicity from the local media, the local Jewish Reds at State University of Buffalo became hysterical.

A large article appeared in the university daily, *The Spectrum*, chronicling the avalanche of concern by the Jewish-Marxist groups over the surfacing of National Socialism in their very midst. A special appeal was announced over WYSL radio announcing the formation of a "coalition" of Marxist and anti-White groups to combat the National Socialists.

HATE MAIL PROBED

VICTORIA (Special) — Hate literature attacking Rosemary Brown (NDP-Vancouver-Burrard) has been sent to B.C. MLAs.

The literature also contains anti-Semitic references. It is unsigned, but refers to a so-called White People's Party in Burnaby.

Attorney-General Alex Macdonald said Monday his department is studying the information for possible prosecution in view of apparent racist utterances. Mrs. Brown is one of two black MLAs elected to the provincial legislature last Aug. 30.

"Hate Mail" Issue Aired Out On Vancouver Radio and Television Stations

The Marxist NDP (New Democratic Party) government in British Columbia is not taking any chances nowadays. That is—in implementing its liberal equalitarian myth.

Recently two Black MLA's (Members of the Legislative Assembly) were elected in British Columbia.

On 30 January, Comrade George Magas discussed over radio CKNW briefly what the NSWPP had in store for Black MLA, Rosemary Brown and the NDP race traitors. (B.C. NDP Premier, David Barrett is Jewish and National Leader, David Lewis also happens to be Jewish).

On 31 January, Comrade James Friesen was also interviewed via Channel 8 television on the same topic.

A few individuals, the Commander observed, have become discouraged because the masses have not become politicized by the millions yet. "We are in pre-revolutionary times, therefore it's understandable why the Movement hasn't reached a mass stage. The masses aren't ready," he added, "and they won't act until economic, political and racial conditions force them to act!"

On 13 February, the Commander appeared with Chicago Co-ordinator Michael Szipronat on Chicago radio station WOPA's "Sounding Board," hosted by Wayne Osborne. During the 70-minute program, the Commander hammered home the racial message of National Socialism. Responses by callers-in were very favorable and many asked for further information on the Party.

Groups charge harassment

'Nazis' disrupt demonstration

A demonstration reportedly held by the National Socialist White People's Party (commonly known as the American Nazi Party) and aimed at various left-wing and liberal factions, among them the Buffalo Labor Committee and the Buffalo Rights Action Group (BRAG), has spurred those groups to plan several defensive and counteroffensive measures.

According to Ira Liebowitz, a member of the Labor Committee, an anti-war rally held in Buffalo on January 15 by the Martin Luther King, Jr. Coalition To End the War, was "infiltrated by a three-man squad of Nazi surveillance agents and provocateurs."

Eyewitnesses have confirmed that two of the uniformed, brown-shirted "Nazis" paraded on the sidewalk with signs taped to three-foot axe handles, which carried the captions, "Gas All Niggers, Reds Like Martin Luther King," and "White Power." A third "Nazi" was observed in the act of photographing various rally leaders.

However, Mr. Liebowitz said that in an announcement broadcast on the radio after the disruption, Carl Hand, the reputed leader of the local cell of the National Socialist White People's Party, maintained that "there had been only two demonstrators and they were not armed with axe handles."

Nevertheless, Mr. Hand reportedly warned that at the next similar public meeting, members of his organization would return in greater numbers and would be armed.

Claiming that the confrontation was a decisive step toward the Nazi party's ultimate goal of unifying right-wing groups in Buffalo, Mr. Liebowitz said it clarified suspicions voiced last summer by Buffalo leftists and liberals that "outright Fascists would emerge and openly organize to disrupt and terrorize labor, welfare, anti-war, and community organizations in this immediate period."

Thus, he said that Mr. Hand had finally been

"flushed out into the public," with the recent occurrences ample proof of an "imminent Nazi threat."

Noting the attempts to secure photographs and license plate numbers, Mr. Liebowitz expressed his dismay that at no time during the right-wing demonstration did any police appear.

Continuing, Mr. Liebowitz said: "These Nazis and similar groups, such as the Legion of Justice, are proud emulators of the policies of mass murder and genocide carried out by their predecessor Adolph Hitler." He contended that such tactics may have been employed in the murder of two labor organizers: Norman Rayford of Local 1199 in Philadelphia and the ILGWU's Eugene Hampton in Kentucky.

Amidst the furor resulting from the incident, members of the Buffalo Labor Committee demanded that Mayor Frank Sedita, the Common Council, the Police Department and other "appropriate" agencies "keep the streets clean of all Nazi provocateurs and terrorists."

Furthermore, they asserted that if decisive action were not undertaken immediately by the Buffalo Police Department, "prima facie evidence" of alleged collaboration between the police department and "right wing terrorist organizations" would be substantiated.

The Labor Committee also called on every labor, community, leftist and liberal organization in Buffalo to "immediately join us in our current work to prepare and unify our forces in joint defense of our democratic rights," in an effort to prevent "future Nazi outrages."

Mr. Liebowitz asserted that defenses would soon be bolstered by the formation of a joint defense group representing all the factions involved which would protect meetings of these organizations as well as preserve their right to distribute controversial literature.

These precautions include implementing emergency telephone communications, which would enable any group in the defense network to instantaneously contact any other one.

Mr. Friesen exposed the election farce and Mrs. Brown as working for Black interests, giving the Black clenched fist salute and professing to represent the interests of the White majority at the same time.

The interview was televised on Thursday, February 1 on "News Hour."

Banner Still Flies in Baltimore

On 9 February three local leftists made an unsuccessful attempt to remove the Swastika banner flying from the second story window of the Party building in Baltimore, located on Eastern Avenue.

Two of them went into the bookstore situated on the first floor of the building and tried to distract Wolfgang Schrodt, who was then on duty, while their cohort outside in the street lassoed the flagpole on the second story level in an effort to bring the NS standard down.

Sighting the man outside, Schrodt headed for the door to the street. When the two men tried to stop him he knocked them both aside and charged towards their accomplice outside, where he grabbed the rope out of his hand. A fist fight ensued, with a crowd gathering around, before the police arrived. Comrade Schrodt was arrested along with his antagonists and booked on a disorderly charge, although he had been protecting his property. The case is now pending before the court. The banner was removed to the third story level of the building to assure it's safety and is flying today.

30 Wreaths Mark Death of Lincoln

WASHINGTON (AP) — The memory of Abraham Lincoln was evoked Monday, on the 164th anniversary of his birth, by a presidential assistant who said "we expect to enter a golden era of peace."

Mrs. Anne Armstrong, counselor to the President, read a message from President Nixon at a wreath laying ceremony at the Lincoln Memorial as several hundred watched in sunny, sub-freezing weather.

"In troubled times he set the nation on its course," Mrs. Armstrong said after placing a wreath of red and white carnations in front of the heroic statue of Lincoln.

The presidential wreath was the first of 30 placed in a half-hour ceremony. Each was carried up the broad stairs of the memorial through an honor guard carrying the flag of each state.

Diplomatic Corps Wreath

Ambassador Samuel Edward Peal of Liberia placed the wreath of the diplomatic corps. Among others were ones from the Dames of the Loyal Legion of the United States, the Society of Mayflower Descendants, and the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

After the guests had departed, six men in the black pants and brown shirts of the American Nazi Party, wearing swastika armbands, brought a wreath with the inscription: "Abraham Lincoln, Champion of Racial Separation."

Two men put it in front of the presidential wreath.

Wreath Laid at Lincoln Memorial

A large wreath, bearing the red, white and blue national colors and a golden Swastika, was placed at the base of Lincoln's statue in the Lincoln Memorial on 12 February.

Lt. Robert Homan, the National Secretary, and a Stormtroop color guard stood for an hour and a half in the cold, sunny February morning awaiting veteran's organizations, and other patriotic groups before presenting the Party's wreath.

Numerous tourists and participants in the ceremonies at the Lincoln Memorial came by and read the inscription on the bright red ribbon of the National Socialist wreath: Abraham Lincoln, 1809-1865, Champion of Racial Separation.

TL Clifford Ward accompanied the National Secretary up the steps of the monument into the foyer and helped place the wreath before the statue of Lincoln. The several hundred spectators watched in hushed stillness as the two National Socialists stood in silence for 30 seconds and gave the Aryan salute before returning to the Stormtroop column waiting outside at attention.

Los Angeles Unit Prepares to Meet JDL

Tension has been building in the city of El Monte as the date approaches when the Jewish Defense League is supposedly to appear in front of the Party's local headquarters on North Peck Road and have a "showdown."

Lt. Joseph Tommasi reports that the local government is very apprehensive, remembering what happened in January, 1972 (see Bulletin No. 103) when the JDL first attempted to "drive" the Party out of El Monte.

Illegal Nazi Meeting Trial Set for El Monte Court

The trial of American Nazi leader Joseph C. Tommasi on charges of holding meetings in a commercial building without a permit has been set for March 5 in El Monte Municipal Court.

Judge Edward C. Nitsch denied Tommasi a continuance. Tommasi said he would try to obtain the American Civil Liberties Union to represent him.

The misdemeanor charges

against Tommasi were filed more than a year ago after a fire inspector noted that Tommasi had items for sale at the headquarters located at 4375 N. Peck Rd.

Tommasi must obtain an attorney. He has previously been represented by James Raymond White III, but White was disbarred by the Supreme Court in December.

City Braces For Trouble

EL MONTE — Police and city officials are bracing for another mass demonstration promised for March in another attempt to oust the Nazis from El Monte.

Irv Rubin, west coast coordinator for the Jewish Defense League (JDL), announced the demonstration is tentatively set for noon, March 4, at the headquarters of the National Socialist White People's Party at 4375 N. Peck Rd.

Rubin made the announcement Tuesday, exactly a year from the last mass demonstration at the headquarters that led to 40 arrests in a five-hour melee.

Rubin said the demonstration will be "militant — as you know we're not an organization known for using peaceful means."

"We're going to bring our rifles down this time," he said. "This time we'll be staying for hours and hours."

City officials already are beginning to plan for the demonstration and will make a concentrated effort to research to find any legal means by which the demonstration could be halted.

However, the outlook is grim. Kenneth Botts, who said research failed to turn up any al-

ternative last year when the demonstration was planned.

"We will be totally prepared for whatever the situation might demand," Botts said. "But it makes me very angry. I detest the JDL thinking they should take the law in their own hands and using our permissive society as their crutch at the danger and expense of the people in this community."

Councilman Elmer Geronson also attacked the JDL for planning an "explosive situation" and for using tactics "just as irresponsible and militant" as those used by the Nazis.

"Very, very frankly, I'll meet force with force — this is getting ridiculous," Geronson said. "I'm a peaceful man to a point — they can push me so far and that's it."

The brunt of any demonstration, of course, falls to the police.

Police Chief Orval Davis said Tuesday he is not worried about the demonstration since he considers it to be "a smoke screen and just a bunch of baloney."

"If the JDL wants to come out — be our guests," Davis invited. "We've had them once and we'll try them on for size. I don't think they can raise enough people to come out and do too much anyway."

Davis said the "curiosity seekers" should stay away from the demonstration since innocent people could get hurt or killed.

Still, he admitted, he knows there will be onlookers at any type of demonstration.

"We will be the barrier between those idiots and the idiots doing the fighting," he said. "We've just had this clear up to our ears."

Nazi Party Leader Joseph Tommasi also urged that people stay away from the demonstration since "curiosity can kill a cat."

"I certainly don't want to see anybody get hurt except him and his people (Rubin and the JDL)," Tommasi said.

Obviously delighted at the thought of another confrontation with the JDL, Tommasi said Rubin's promise to bring rifles is "pretty drastic."

"I'm sure they're not going to stop at empty guns," he continued. "Any gesture with one of their rifles . . . they're going to get killed — we'll shoot them."

"We don't care what happens now," Tommasi said. "We'll make sure we don't start any-

thing, but we'll make sure we finish it. We'll let them hang themselves."

The JDL says the demonstration is planned as a result of the city's "no action" policy in ousting the Nazis from El Monte.

A case against the party for operating without a permit has been bogged down in Municipal Court for a year, and just last week was postponed again.

"We have done everything we possibly can through the due process of law to correct the problem," said Botts. "Why don't they take their fight against the process of law where the court is sympathetic with the appeals of the defendant to constantly continue the case. I don't think the normal citizen would get that type of lenient consideration from the court."

"This city will just not tolerate this type of activity," promised Mayor Jack Crippen, who said the city will begin immediately to prepare for a confrontation which could be dangerous to citizens of El Monte.

"We don't like this hate going on — to continue to carry this thing on and on, I just can't understand it," he said sadly.
