NS Vote in Baltimore Shows Whites Turning to Party

Party member Wolfgang Schrodt concluded his campaign for city councilman in the city's First District on 4 November with 1400 votes – about 12 percent of the total White vote. Despite the lack of funds and well-paid political machinery, Schrodt exceeded even his own expectations. The supposed 'hostility' which his opponents expected to inflame residents of the predominantly-Polish district could not prevent him from achieving an outstanding victory. The Democrats and Republicans had spent thousands of dollars on their campaigns, but people made it clear they wanted a White People's candidate. Even though a total news blackout had been imposed on his candidacy by local news media, the votes piled up unbelievably. Comrade Schrodt shocked all his opponents on election day. Some candidates were publicly threatening to boycott all council functions should they and the National Socialist win!

Projected out as representative of the political sympathies of a like proportion of White residents of the entire city, this would mean about 70,000 people agree with and would vote for an openly National Socialist candidate! Not some two-faced, conservative or sneaky racist. But an energetic, Swastika-wearing National Socialist ready to *fight* for the Whites!

Many valuable lessons and techniques were learned in this campaign which will be applied in further races involving National Socialists as they occur in different parts of the nation. To all those who participated in his campaign, Comrade Schrodt wishes to express his thanks.

Blacks and Jews Blaming Party for 'Lynching'

The group of articles here reprinted represent some of the accusations against the Party and actions taken by Blacks and Jews of the Pasadena NAACP as a result of the L.A. Unit's intensive activity program in that city. Southern California District officers have reason to believe the main accusation leveled at the Party of a so-call lynching of a Black "reverend" is nothing but a cleverly organized hoax. District Organizer Martin Kerr has been co-operating with Pasadena police in their investigation into the incident.



National Socialists from the St. Louis area, marching in casual dress, carried a huge Swastika-emblazoned pro-White life banner in an anti-abortion rally and march through downtown St. Louis recently. The contingent reached nearly 30,000 White Missourians gathered together to protest the insanity of aborting beautiful White babies. (Negroes, who view birth-control as a White plot to reduce the Black population, and who are subsidized with welfare for every niggerlet they produce, seldom have abortions. 'Liberated' White women, however, brainwashed to believe that having babies is "old-fashioned," "un-feminist," etc., do.) Throughout the half-day activity, many people complimented the NS contingent on the slogan and legibility of their banner – the second biggest in the march.

Kyle told the Board of Aldermen at a hearing held Saturday morning he had been read to from pornographic novels and been invited to touch a female employe of the Reading Room, 8100 Page Blvd., after she had raised her short negligee and removed her panties.

The board took no action at the hearing, continued from Oct. 11 and held to determine if Allan Solomon, owner of the Reading Room, should have his business license revoked be-curse it violates city ordinances or because he

"I went to the Reading Room on Oct. 23," explained Kyle, "and upon entering a girl who identified herself as Beverly asked if I wanted a reading. She told me it would cost \$12 for a 20 minute i long reading and \$24 for an hour-long reading. She lais o said customers were allowed to tip for various services and she would remove various portions of her cloth-ing. For more money she said the customer could touch various parts of her body. "T said I wanted a reading and gave her \$12

could touch various parts of her body. "I said I wanted a reading and gave her \$12 in marked bills. Then I followed her to the room in the south part of the building where there was a reclining chair, a wooden chair, some paper towies and some body lotion. I sat in the reclining chair.

"She then read to me from several paper-

back books," continued Kyle. "They described sexual acts between the characters. "She then said for a tip she would remove some clothing. I gave her \$13 in marked bills and she moved her chair close to mine, raised her short nggligee, removed her panties and said I could touch her, which, for the purposes of investigation, I did."

At the beginning of the meeting, the Ngzis, whose num-ber included one woman, unfurled a huge banner reading "Stop Forced Busing." Large swartikas were painted at each end.

They stood with their arms outstretched in a Nazi salute before the banner.

Joel Mitchell, a member of the Black Teachers Caucus, re-turned the salute with an obscene

Mitchell later stepped to the microphone and demanded that

the Nazis be thrown out. To Mrs. Abrahamson, he yelled:

"As a Jew, you ought to speak Do you have any commit-t to what you should stand
