NS Vote in Baltimore Shows Whites Turning to Party

Party member Wolfgang Schrodtt concluded his campaign for city councilman in the city's First District on 4 November with 1400 votes — about 12 percent of the total White vote. Despite the lack of funds and well-paid political machinery, Schrodtt exceeded even his own expectations. The supposed 'hostility' which his opponents expected to inflame residents of the predominantly-Polish district could not prevent him from achieving an outstanding victory. The Democrats and Republicans had spent thousands of dollars on their campaigns, but people made it clear they wanted a White People's candidate. Even though a total news blackout had been imposed on his candidacy by local news media, the votes piled up unbelievably. Comrade Schrodtt shocked all his opponents on election day. Some candidates were publicly threatening to boycott all council functions should they and the National Socialist win!

Projected out as representative of the political sympathies of a like proportion of White residents of the entire city, this would mean about 70,000 people agree with and would vote for an openly National Socialist candidate! Not some two-faced, conservative or sneaky racist. But an energetic, Swastika-wearing National Socialist ready to *fight* for the Whites!

Many valuable lessons and techniques were learned in this campaign which will be applied in further races involving National Socialists as they occur in different parts of the nation. To all those who participated in his campaign, Comrade Schrodtt wishes to express his thanks.

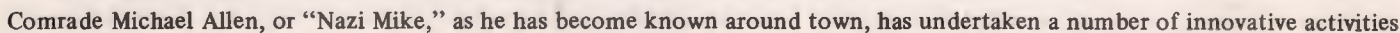
At a time of year when crass materialism seeks to undermine the true meaning of the season, every National Socialist should certainly want to include the Party on their list of those to receive gifts.

Nazi Leads Petition Drive In Breckenridge

A Breckenridge Hills man who is an officer of the American Nazi party and plans to run next April for the village Board of Trustees is the apparent leader in a petition drive for improved street lighting on Dix Avenue, where he lives.

Michael Allen, unit secretary at the Breckenridge Hills headquarters of the Greater St. Louis Nazi party, presented the petition with 42 signatures at the Nov. 3 board meeting and plans to pursue the matter at its next meeting at 7 p.m. Monday.

Allen initiated the petition, which asks the board to ask Union Electric Co. to survey Dix, which is several blocks long and has 50 residences, and suggest ways to improve the street lighting, such as

more lights, increased intensity or trimming of obstructing tree branches.

Allen said the petition also seeks action on a vacant house on the street. He said residents wanted the house razed or boarded up because it was becoming a neighborhood eyesore and hiding place for "criminal elements."

Of the 43 persons he contacted on the block, Allen said, only one declined to sign the petition on the ground that he did not want to get involved. Seven were not home when he called.

Allen said the Dix residents knew of his leadership in the Nazi party. He said he will announce his candidacy for the village board at a press conference next month.

Officer Testifies 'Reading Room' Panders To Prurience

VINITA PARK — Police officer Edward L. Kyle told the Board of Aldermen at a hearing held Saturday morning he had been read to from pornographic novels and been invited to touch a female employee of the Reading Room, 8100 Page Blvd., after she had raised her short negligee and removed her panties.

Kyle posed as a Reading Room customer twice to investigate the type of business being conducted there.

The board took no action at the hearing, continued from Oct. 11 and held to determine if Allan Solomon, owner of the Reading Room, should have his business license revoked because it violates city ordinances or because he had misrepresented himself when he applied for a business license and occupancy permit.

"I went to the Reading Room on Oct. 23," explained Kyle, "and upon entering a girl who identified herself as Beverly asked if I wanted a reading. She told me it would cost \$12 for a 20-minute long reading and \$24 for an hour-long reading. She also said customers were allowed to tip for various services and she would remove various portions of her clothing. For more money she said the customer could touch various parts of her body."

"I said I wanted a reading and gave her \$12 in marked bills. Then I followed her to the room in the south part of the building where there was a reclining chair, a wooden chair, some paper towels and some body lotion. I sat in the reclining chair.

"She then read to me from several paperback books," continued Kyle. "They described sexual acts between the characters."

"She then said for a tip she would remove some clothing. I gave her \$13 in marked bills and she moved her chair close to mine, raised her short negligee, removed her panties and said I could touch her, which, for the purposes of investigation, I did."

Arthur Stuedeman, city tax collector, told the board Solomon had said he intended to hold group discussions and rehearse theatrical drama with five or six students at 8100 Page, when he applied for the business license. Solomon also said he would have an inventory of books and literature, Stuedeman said. He is responsible for issuing all business licenses.

Irwin H. Brown, director of public works, said Solomon told him when he applied for an occupancy permit, he intended to give reading instructions to people wishing to improve their ability to read aloud.

Kyle said he had asked for summonses from the county prosecuting attorney's office in July but they had been denied.

Harvey Feldman, Solomon's attorney appeared at the hearing, Solomon did not.

The board will meet Saturday, Nov. 1, at 9:30 a.m. to make its decision on the revocation of the license.

Reading Room Is Closed!

With very little fanfare, the controversial Reading Room Operating at 8100 Page ave. in Vinita Park closed its doors at noon on Friday, and according to Police Chief Robert Hartz, Allan Solomon returned to the business of locksmithing.

Pickers from an American "Nazi" group appeared on the scene displaying placards, extremely offensive and racist, and Hartz said, police ended the incident before further disturbance was created.

A meeting scheduled by the Vinita Park board of aldermen for Saturday morning, designed to make a final disposition of the Reading Room problem, was cancelled.

in past weeks along with several other supporters, including: running for shop steward in the factory where he works, getting nearly 24 percent of the vote; and personally presenting a letter calling for a ban on Marxism to the mayor of St. Louis. On 3 November, Comrade Allen stunned the Breckenridge town council by presenting a petition—signed by 42 out of 50 families residing on his street—for additional street lights in his neighborhood. This would help cut down on the increasing Black crime there. This sort of community support for a National Socialist was a real shock to the local board, according to Comrade Ruf. Comrade Allen's neighbors have even begun coming to him with more complaints to set before the board. Several folks have gone so far as to suggest he consider running for town councilman!

On 31 October, ST Allen organized a picket of the Vinita Park "Reading Room", owned by a certain Allan Solomon. Actually this seemingly innocent and quiet reading room was a front for pornographic prostitution and perversion! Signs utilized by the ST included "Jews Are Behind Pornography", and "Reading Room Is a Porno Front!"

The same day of the picket, the Jew owner closed down his "reading room".

Penn Theater is picketed by 4 Nazi-uniformed men

A group of four young men dressed in Nazi military uniforms were demonstrating at the Penn Theater in Plymouth Saturday afternoon against the Billy Graham film being shown—"The Hiding Place."

All four, from Livonia, are forming a National Socialist (Nazi) White Peoples Party in the suburbs as a measure to counteract busing to achieve racial integration.

A spokesman for the group said they were protesting the movie because it promoted hate against National Socialists, promulgated what the group sees as a "myth" that six million Jews were killed by the Nazis, and overlooked war crimes committed by the U.S. and its allies.

ERIC STEELE of Livonia, a leader of the Livonia-based NSWPP group, said his organization has moved to the suburbs here and is gaining membership because of the busing issue.

"We object to 'The Hiding Place' because World War II happened more than 30 years ago. The United States, with its atom bomb, has wiped out more people than the National Socialists in Germany ever did. This movie is a distortion and preaches hate against National Socialists."

"We don't believe six million Jews were killed by the Nazis in World War II—that's a myth. We don't advocate

killing Jews or blacks. But we do object to the falsehoods in this film."

The film, a Billy Graham production, tells about the ordeal of a Christian family attempting to spread Christianity and aid Jews while living in Holland during the war.

The movie has attracted a number of area church groups to the Penn Theater during its showing. In fact, on the day of the demonstration, a bus from the Plymouth Road Baptist Chapel was parked behind the Penn Theater on Penniman near Main Street in Plymouth.

Plymouth police squad cars patrolled past the theater, keeping a close watch. One patrol car stopped while this reporter was there, and an officer encouraged youngsters to clear the sidewalk. Steele commented that police departments have been very cooperative with his group because he has assured them of peaceful demonstrations.

ANOTHER PURPOSE for the demonstration, Steele said, was to protest the imprisonment of Rudolf Hess.

"The only thing Hess ever did was to try and stop the war and the U.S. imprisoned him. He's now 85 years old, still in jail, and in solitary confinement. That's inhumane."

"America and the Allies are willing

to release Hess because he is an old man now, but the Soviet Union objects. So in the spirit of détente, the U.S. is refusing to release Hess."

"Why hasn't anyone made a movie about what the communists did in Korea or Vietnam? A couple of our members picketing today served in the Vietnam War."

STEELE WOULDN'T give the names of the other three marchers because it is the NSWPP's policy only to release names of its leaders.

Steele said the party now is planning to obtain legal power by seeking public office and plans to run candidates for the Livonia Board of Education this June. The group also is seeking permission to hold a public rally at Ford Field in Livonia.

While marching in front of the Penn, the demonstrators were passing out literature urging "Freedom for Rudolf Hess."

The leaflets contained a policy statement which read: "The National Socialist White Peoples Party is made up of Americans who believe in America and the White race, like most Americans do. And, we are willing to stand up and fight for our nation and race to protect and advance them. We believe in the greatness of our country and its traditions. We believe that America should be run for decent White folks, not for Black pressure groups or Communist traitors."

NSWO of the Southern California District picketed the West Coast regional headquarters of the so-called anti-Communist John Birch Society.

During the hour and a half picket, the ST carried signs reading: "Communism is Jewish" and "Smash Communism" in an effort to urge members and leaders of the JBS to take a more militant stand in the fight against Communism.

Once the National Socialist demonstrators had arrived the kosher conservatives closed down the bookstore and cowered at the chants of "Communism is Jewish!" given by the ST.

During the demonstration, members of the NSWO distributed WHITE POWER newspapers to interested spectators. An overall favorable response was shown by the onlookers, reports Comrade Winkleman.

Busing Confrontation Led by Louisville National Socialist

Backed by hundreds of angry White parents who've had their kids thrown onto buses and shipped over to Black schools, NS Comrade Ervin Halbleib blasted Jefferson County's busing program during a heated hearing on that subject in the White community of Fairdale, a center of anti-busing sentiment in Louisville. The two articles here from Kentucky's two largest papers describes what happened.

Busing-alternatives hearing in Fairdale ends in bedlam

They jammed around the tiny table where Jefferson County Judge Todd Hollenbach sat in Fairdale last night, some pointing fingers, some shaking their fists, all of them shouting.

Behind them, another 250 or so Fairdale residents screamed, waved signs and slammed their metal chairs to the floor repeatedly.

The forum, which had from the start the flavor of an anti-busing rally, lost order after two speakers — one a self-professed Nazi, the other a member of a pro-busing group, Progress in Education — approached the microphone.

The man who said he was a Nazi, Ervin Halbleib, received some boos and a small chorus of cheers as he recited a message of "white power." At one point the swastika worn by the young, blond man was taken from his arm and torn into pieces.

Didn't get to speak

The pro-busing speaker, Link Martin, never got a chance to speak. The screaming crowd banged its chairs and demanded that Martin be ejected, then swarmed around Hollenbach's table where the judge sat. "Adjourn the meeting!" one Progress in Education member shouted at Hollenbach. "If he can't speak, nobody can! Admit you can't keep order in your own county!"

"I've got two kids," yelled a black-haired woman "and if you think for one minute I'm going to stick my kids on a bus..." She burst into tears.

"Wait a minute — let me finish, let me finish, let me finish," the judge said. "What you're fighting for is your constitutional rights..." The one right we all have in this country is the right to express ourselves.

"No, not!" a woman yelled back. "I couldn't speak when they started busing!"

Some cheered as Halbleib said "the only solution to busing is to stop it. They're trying to destroy our culture."

But Martin, a lanky, bearded youth, said only, "How do they know what I'm going to say?" as he stood before the screaming crowd.

Before the incident at last night's ses-

sion, a parade of speakers had harangued the crowd with speeches against busing and the "Marxist-minded social planners" one speaker said were responsible for it.

After some 90 minutes of talking — mostly about individual citizens' problems and their attitudes toward busing — the crowd drifted away.

Hostility disrupts hearing on busing

A hostile crowd in Fairdale last night disrupted the last in a series of public hearings on alternatives to busing.

Scuffles, shouts and verbal threats erupted when two speakers — the first a professed Nazi and the second a spokes-

man for a pro-busing group — tried to speak to the crowd of more than 250 who jammed the Fairdale Community Center, 2801 N. Linn, Louisville.

Jefferson County Judge Todd Hollenbach, who later told a reporter he had found no workable alternatives to busing through the hearings he sponsored, was jeered and verbally threatened when he arrived 20 minutes after the meeting began.

Hollenbach called off the meeting less than 50 minutes after it began, saying the arrival of representatives of Progress in Education (PIE) contributed to the tension in the smoke-filled meeting hall.

It was when a member of PIE, Link Martin, came to the microphone that the wild jeers, slamming of metal chairs against the floor and shouts of "Communist! Communist!" erupted.

Hollenbach directed county officials, who conducted the meeting, to prevent Martin from speaking.

Momentary silence, Ervin Halbleib was allowed to speak. However, some members of the audience jeered the blond-haired man as he strode to the microphone, dressed in a khaki uniform with a swastika armband.

One angry woman ran to him and tore the armband off, then ripped it into small pieces.

Halbleib, apparently nonplused, continued to speak and then called for "all Communist traitors who started busing" to be shot and urged separate schools for whites and blacks.

Many people in the crowd chanted with him as he raised his arm in the air and shouted: "White Power! White Power!" He later told a reporter that he is a member of the National Socialist White People's Party, that he is a Nazi, and that he believes "Hitler was the salvation of Christian white civilization."

Martin, the PIE spokesman, was unable to say anything before he was booted from the floor.

The hearing examiner last night was Gary Levy, director of environmental quality for the county. He called the atmosphere at Fairdale "a bad scene."

Early in the meeting Levy told the crowd that "praise or disagreement with busing is not the purpose of this meeting." The purpose, he said, was to suggest alternatives to busing.

School meeting erupts at Nazis

The presence of nine uniformed Nazis was enough to disrupt the school board meeting last night.

Board president Lucille Abrahamson recessed the meeting twice because of shouting between the Nazis and members of the audience. At one point, seven uniformed police arrived and another half-dozen plainclothes police were in the room.

Although tempers and language grew hot, there was no violence.

At the beginning of the meeting, the Nazis, whose number included one woman, unfurled a huge banner reading "Stop Forced Busing." Large swastikas were painted at each end.

They stood with their arms outstretched in a Nazi salute before the banner.

Joel Mitchell, a member of the Black Teachers Caucus, returned the salute with an obscene gesture.

Mitchell later stepped to the microphone and demanded that

the Nazis be thrown out. To Mrs. Abrahamson, he yelled:

"As a Jew, you ought to speak out. Do you have any commitment to what you should stand for?"

"Move those germs out!"

"Everybody knows who the germs are," responded Nazi leader Allen Vincent.

Several Jews left the room in protest as a shouting match ensued. Five members of the Teachers Action Caucus stood in front of the banner trying to block it.

The Nazis left quietly soon after as the audience hissed.

Vincent said he had come to speak on Supt. Robert Alloto's proposed administrative appointments. Three of the four nominees are minorities. Vincent left without addressing the board.

Mrs. Abrahamson later told the audience she had recently returned from a two-week trip to Israel. "It is very difficult to remember our and their (the Nazis) constitutional rights," she said emotionally. "I'm very proud of the people who survived the holocaust."

Northern California ST Return to San Francisco School Board

On Tuesday, 11 November, two teams of ST, 1 NSWO member and five plainclothes supporters under the command of TL Allan Vincent attended a San Francisco school board meeting. Other than the obscene remarks and gestures of a Black teacher, no incidents occurred.
