In turning him down, the suburban Breckenridge Hills board of trustees cited the possibility of violence stemming from "inflammatory remarks" from National Socialists. Nazis Defy Breckenridge Hills And Will Hold Rally

A leader of the St. Louis-area Nazi Party says he will hold a rally Saturday in a Breckenridge Hills park in defiance of the wishes of the village Board of Trustees.

Michael Allen, unit secretary of the National Socialist

White People's Party, said the rally would begin at 2 p.m. in Roy Ferguson Park behind the village hall at 3120 Woodson Road. At the rally, Allen said, he will publicize the views of the party and seek support for his candida-

cy for a seat on the village board. The village will elect four trustees for two-year terms Tuesday.

Allen, 24 years old, made a formal request for permission to use the park but was

turned down earlier this month by the board.

The Nazi leader contended that the board had no legal justification for its action.

"They haven't produced any ordinance saying I have

to have a permit," Allen said.

James M. Daly, village attorney, said one reason the board refused permission was that it believed Allen wanted "to vent what we consider very inflammatory and inciting-to-riot type of remarks."

to challenge this decision by holding the rally as scheduled on 3 April. He said that the trustees had no legal basis to deny him his right to assemble, and accused them of interfering in the election process by inhibiting his campaign.

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St. Louis area activists stepped up their vote-seeking activities in Breckenridge Hills as the 6 April election date grew closer. Their efforts have included passing out 'Vote for Allen' leaflets, going door-to-door to tell people about the campaign and putting advertisements in local papers like the one reproduced on the front page.

Comrade Allen is running as an open National Socialist, with the Swastika. In his campaign he has called for additional street lighting and free trash pickup service in the village, along with ordinances barring operations by Communists and smut peddlers. He reports that his proposals have been well received in the community.

Party Included in Network TV Program

On Tuesday, 30 March, NBC Television ran a 90 minute prime-time documentary program entitled "Liberty." It dealt with various American political ideas and groups, including the NSWPP. The Milwaukee Unit was specifically chosen for coverage due to the controversy generated by the recent election campaign there. The segment devoted to the Party lasted over five minutes, and included an interview with Unit Organizer

Tony Schmitt and Unit Secretary Art Jones. Also shown was a typical picket conducted by the Unit, in this case against an anti-NS movie.

Since this program was seen by millions of viewers, it contributed greatly to making the Party more widely known to the American people.

Three-year Plan Lagging

The Three-year Plan is at this point behind schedule. During the month of March we raised only \$547.58. By comparison the Party should be raising approximately \$2,500 a month if it is to reach its goal of \$88,888 by 20 April 1978. If we are going to succeed, we will have to try harder.

Many comrades did their share by making a contribution last month to the Plan, and by doing so helped place their state or province on the map. This graphically shows those areas of North America that are responding — as well as those that aren't. Many areas have done well in this drive so far, but some have responded little or not at all.

This *Bulletin* is being read by National Socialists in every state or province in the U.S. and Canada — and many countries overseas as well. We shall regularly show who is doing their part — and who is not. If every comrade makes a donation of just a dollar or more once a month, there is no reason why the map can't be filled. Let's make this one of our goals!

This Party has no fat-cat millionaires or corporate interests or foreign powers supporting it. All it has is dedicated, hard-working National Socialists like you for financial support. Even though our goal of \$88,888 is comparatively small when compared to the millions of dollars the System parties raise every election year, this amount will propel the Party into a position where it can enter into a phase where it will receive the mass support of hundreds of thousands of people. But to reach the mass-movement phase, we have to raise this amount by *ourselves*.

We still have a lot of time to catch up, though, if everybody does his share. So far we have raised a total of \$13,314.56.

If anybody has any doubts about the importance of the Three-year Plan, they should remember that it is an investment in the future of the White race — *the most important one you can make*.

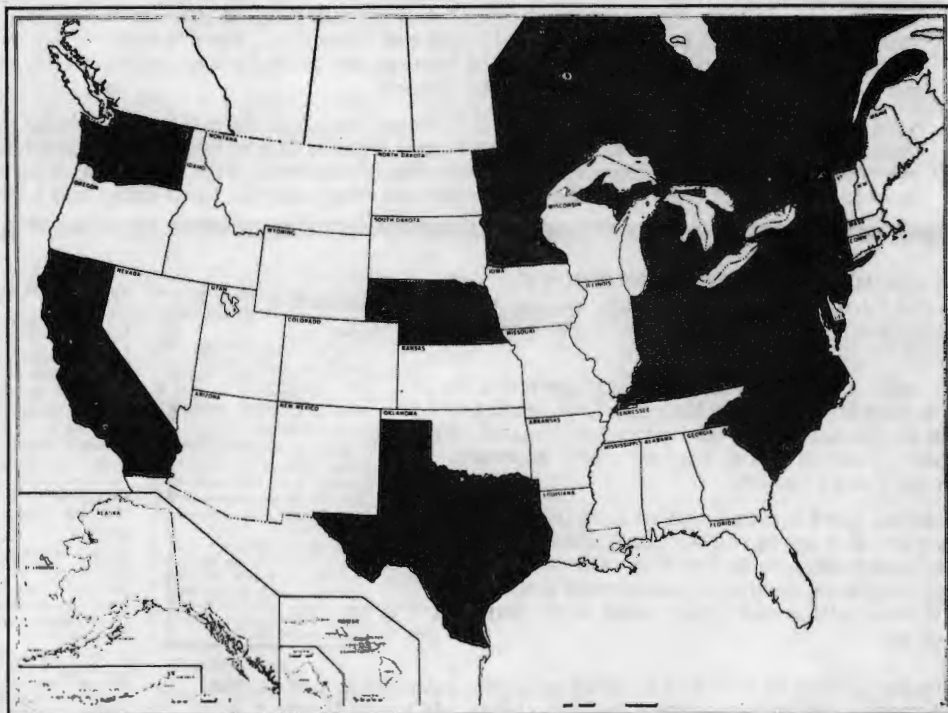

L.A. Unit Activities

The Los Angeles Unit has been keeping up a regular schedule of speaking engagements and paper sales in recent weeks.

On 18 March Unit Organizer Martin Kerr spoke before an all-White police community-relations class at Long Beach City College. After giving a brief history of the Movement, Organizer Kerr explained the Party's ideology. He then went on to explain the NSWPP's present development, emphasizing its participation in local elections. Following his presentation copies of WHITE POWER and "Had Enough, 'PIG'?" leaflets were distributed. Students were then allowed to ask questions. Although initially skeptical, the class had to agree with the soundness of the Party's doctrine of White supremacy. Police officers present

New COINTELPRO-type Operation Aimed at Party

National Headquarters has received reliable information that the FBI, working in conjunction with the Anti-Defamation League of B'nai B'rith, is planning a new program of disruption against the Party following its recent electoral successes in several areas. The new operation is similar to the now-discredited COINTELPRO dirty-tricks campaign against various patriotic White organizations, including the National Socialist White People's Party. Its goal is to stunt the growth of the Movement and impair its effectiveness by: (a) undermining confidence in Party leadership where it is most effective; (b) creating splinter groups; and (c) developing a negative attitude among supporters and contributors which will severely curtail Party funds and disrupt Party operations.

The FBI-ADL plan calls for the use of paid agents as well as persons disaffected from the Party to fabricate and circulate fictitious accusations against the Party and its leadership, to play upon personal differences to pit comrade against comrade, and generally to spread illwill and dissension. Toward their sordid ends, the FBI and ADL have already set up and are funding a number of front groups posing as sincere pro-White, pro-NS outfits but whose real purpose is to do the foul, dirty work of the Enemy.

Such attempts as these can only succeed if National Socialists allow themselves to be duped by the old, familiar dirty tricks tactics of the Federal Bureau and its kosher friends. But as long as every comrade is vigilant, every attempt at provocation will not only expose itself for the vile, treacherous act it is, but will redound to the benefit of the Movement in the form of renewed dedication to the one true Cause of Adolf Hitler and Lincoln Rockwell.

were especially impressed with the Party's stand on the need for a legal revolution to set the U.S. back on its feet. They were also impressed by the NSWPP's law-and-order stand.

On 1 April, a similar presentation was given at a Pasadena high school by Mr. Kerr and Unit Secretary Doug Winkleman. They spoke to approximately 80 students, many of whom were favorably impressed with the Party's policies.

One of the more successful paper sales in recent weeks took place in front of the George Wallace campaign headquarters in Hollywood. The activity drew many onlookers; several expressed their disgust with the Wallace sellout and appreciation of the National Socialists.

Milwaukee National Socialists Present Opposition at Integration Meeting

Like so many other American cities, Milwaukee is facing the specter of forced racial integration. In an attempt to soften the impact of this anti-White scheme and to sap the resistance of White residents, the System sent a highly paid professional race-mixer, John Gronouski, to the city. His assignment was to preach miscegenation as the "law of the land," as something that is inevitable and desirable. But he has been opposed at his recent speaking engagements by members of the Milwaukee Unit, who have attended his meetings. At one such meeting Party Comrade Art Jones asked permission to speak. When this was denied, he denounced the System stooge, infuriating him and other liberals present.

A similar occurrence took place in Racine, WI, at a smaller integration meeting.

The two Milwaukee newspapers gave inaccurate and distorted accounts of the two incidents, which are reproduced at right.

For the Milwaukee Sentinel here tonight is a travesty, he added.

As a question and answer period was ending, following the talks, Arthur Jones, public relations director for the local Nazi Party, shouted accusations at McMurrin.

Jones, an unsuccessful candidate for mayor in the recent primary, booed the panel at the end of the program but was drowned out by applause and whistles.

He later confronted McMurrin and called him names. Two identified men then attempted to bodily throw Jones out, saying, "Get outta here." The scuffle was broken up and Jones walked out.

Washington, D.C., Madison, Wis., or Austin," Gronouski replied testily.

"It is because we do not have integrated neighborhoods that we get into the problems and emotions we have now," he added.

Among those in the audience were nine persons wearing the uniform of the Nazi Party. They sat in the back row with other sympathizers nearby.

The audience may not have liked what Gronouski was telling them, but they disliked even more the Nazis and their racial slurs near the end of the meeting.

As the Nazis, including Arthur Jones, former mayoral candidate and head of the Nazi Party here, began yelling, the audience began clapping to drown out them.

Police Watch Nazis

The Nazis were watched by several Milwaukee policemen who were joined by an off duty policeman there as an audience member to question Gronouski.

Near the end of the meeting, Mrs. Joyce Shoemaker, a member of the school community who is 5 feet tall, marched to the back of the room and screamed into Jones' face, "Leave. Leave. Leave."

The Nazis were escorted from the school building by the police and when Mrs. Shoemaker returned to the front of the room, Gronouski told her, "You're pretty tough."

The Court Order allowed Milwaukee a great deal of flexibility, Gronouski said.

"I think we are very lucky, as compared to Louisville or Boston," he said.

About 10 uniformed members of Milwaukee's Nazi Party, including Arthur Jones, an unsuccessful candidate for mayor in the primary, attended the meeting and requested permission to speak.

Limited to Residents

However, Joyce Shoemaker, a member of the Hamilton Parents Booster Club, who presided at the microphone, announced that speakers would be limited to Hamilton District residents.

When the Nazis were not permitted to speak at the end of the meeting, Jones and other Nazis began hurling insults at Gronouski and Mrs. Shoemaker. She asked them to leave, but they refused. Walking up to him, she shouted: "Leave, leave, leave!"

Finally, when police suggested they leave, the Nazis left the meeting.

After the incident, Gronouski told Mrs. Shoemaker: "You're pretty tough."

"They weren't being gentlemen," Mrs. Shoemaker said later.

Jones said Saturday that Mrs. Shoemaker had permitted residents outside the Hamilton District to speak. He said her refusal to allow his group to present their views triggered the outburst.

Question Answered

However Mrs. Shoemaker insisted that only one person who was not a Hamilton District resident was allowed to speak. He was a resident of the Madison district who was called to the microphone to answer a question at the urging of a Hamilton parent, she said.

At least one uniformed Milwaukee police officer was present at the meeting plus another man in the audience who identified himself as an off-duty policeman. Both Jones and Mrs. Shoemaker said their respective organizations had notified the police of the meeting.

Earlier Friday, Gronouski met with parents and teachers.

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
