## **Party Meets IRS Deadline!**

The Movement narrowly avoided disaster in March when the Party paid some \$26,000 demanded of it by the Internal Revenue Service at the last possible moment.

That sum was hand-delivered to the IRS in three separate payments during the week of 8 through 12 March. The Party paid half the amount on 8 March, the date the IRS had set as a final deadline, and asked for an extension to raise the remaining balance. Although the IRS normally grants such extensions and installment payments to those who show that they are making a sincere effort to pay their taxes, these options were denied the Party.

However, IRS officers informed the Party that the bureaucratic red tape involved in seizing Movement assets --- such as the national headquarters building --- made it unlikely that action would be taken against the Party before the morning of Monday, 15 March. Thus, although a formal extension was denied the Party, government inefficiency and slowness allowed the Commander four precious additional days to raise the second \$13,000.

To the disappointment of Party enemies everywhere, the Commander was successful in obtaining this amount. The final payment was made late in the afternoon of Friday, 12 March. This removed the immediate danger of the headquarters building being seized.

### **More IRS Harassment**

But although the generosity of NS comrades throughout the world and the skill and determination of Matt Koehl has averted this potential disaster, the Movement is not out of the woods yet.

Ten days before the 8 March tax deadline, the IRS hit the Party for another bill for \$6,500. This bill stems from a minor technical error in the Party's 1975 tax filing, which the IRS has now decided to exploit.

This new tax bill is due on *15 April*.

### **Appeal, Loans Save the Party**

As mentioned above, it was the sacrificial generosity of National Socialists in the U.S., Canada and abroad which enabled the Party to overcome this extreme financial difficulty.

The Survival Appeal proved to be one of the most successful fundraising drives in Party history. Over \$3,000 was donated to the Party during January. Added to monies contributed earlier, the Appeal total as of 31 January stood at \$16,046.90.

Additionally, a number of comrades loaned the Party money --- which must now be repaid.

## Distorted Media Coverage — As Usual

The Party received extensive local media coverage of its battle with the IRS. As on previous occasions when the Movement was in trouble, the media beat a path to our door in gleeful anticipation of reporting the death of the Party. One Associated Press story was distributed nationwide in which National Organizer Martin Kerr was quoted as saying that the seizure of the national headquarters building and the collapse of the Party were "imminent."

However, when it turned out that the Movement was able to pay the astronomical sum demanded of it and avoid catastrophe, the media decided to drop the story. The Party's success in raising \$26,000 --- half of it in four days --- just wasn't deemed newsworthy and was ignored by the press, except for a tiny article in one small Arlington newspaper.

### A Reminder from the Membership Secretary

*Although the bitter struggle with the federal government over the Movement's economic survival has been concluded successfully, it has left the Party financially exhausted. Additionally, despite this exhaustion, we must now come up with another \$6,500 by mid-April.*

*Besides these special expenses, we still have our regular bills to pay, including printing, payroll, utilities, telephone and others. And of course we must repay the money lent to us by Party comrades on a short-term basis, which was used to overcome the crisis.*

*All Party Members, Probationary Members and Official Supporters are urged to keep their dues and pledge payments up to date. We would further appreciate it if, whenever possible, dues and pledge payments be made in advance.*

*If every comrade remains steadfast and loyal, we will be able to emerge from this period of hardship without serious financial dislocation. Now more than ever, the prompt and regular payment of every comrade's financial obligation to the Movement is of the utmost importance.*

## IRS Bill Paid Under Protest

We would like to reiterate that the Movement disputes the gigantic tax bill of \$26,000 which the IRS demanded. The Movement contests this bill and the IRS handling of it on three grounds:

1. The bill was levied primarily against monies the Movement received in unsolicited contributions. No political organization is required to pay taxes on such income, and in fact this is the first time in the 23-year history of the Party that we have been asked to do so.

2. The IRS refused to let us satisfy the bill by way of monthly installment payments, although this is normally the procedure employed by the IRS in cases such as ours. Furthermore, the IRS had initially indicated that this option would be open to us --- only to change its mind at the last minute.

3. The IRS refused to grant an extension to the Party after we had paid the first \$13,000 of the bill. Again, granting such an extension after a substantial partial payment has been made is standard IRS procedure. An extension was also denied after a total of \$17,000 was paid.

The refusal of the government to grant us the methods of payment usually allowed other taxpayers is especially reprehensible in view of the contested nature of the IRS' claims. It is the Movement's contention that these actions of the federal government constitute blatant harassment of the Party, and we intend to pursue the matter further.

### Race-Treason in the Cloth

Most National Socialists realize that truth and fair-play do not act as constraints on our more outspoken adversaries. This is true even when these adversaries purport to be upholders of decency and paragons of spiritual virtue.

A case in point is illustrated by the following incident, which the Indianapolis Unit relayed to National Headquarters in its monthly activity report for January:

"A friend of the unit reported that a local Catholic grade school was teaching students that 'the Swastika was really a Christian cross that was twisted because the Nazis hated religion.' Also that 'Hitler wanted only blond and blue-eyed people to exist, which was stupid because Hitler himself had dark hair.' Contact was made with the instructor and materials were made available to him which showed the error of such teachings. We asked to be allowed to speak to his class and answer any questions his students had on National Socialism. This was denied. The priest said that even if he was a little off base in some of the things that he taught his pupils, he still would not let the 'Nazis' spread their 'hate' in that school."

# IRS May Seize Nazi Offices

Officials of the Nazi Party will meet with the Internal Revenue Service today in a last-minute attempt to prevent the federal government from seizing the group's national headquarters in Arlington, a party spokesman said Saturday.

Martin Kerr said the Nazis, formally called the National Socialist White People's Party, will try to resolve a continuing controversy over \$26,000 in back taxes.

Kerr said the IRS has threatened to seize the building the party owns at 2507 N. Franklin Road tomorrow if the taxes aren't paid.

IRS officials would not comment on the details of the case. Susan Linden-Brooks, a spokeswoman for the IRS regional office in

Richmond, said a lien on the property would have to be filed in Arlington Circuit Court before seizure could take place.

On Friday, no record of a lien could be found at the court. But Linden-Brooks said a lien can be filed at the last minute. She added that the IRS does not always seize property when liens are filed.

The party bought the white two-story duplex it shares with a doctor in 1974. Residents of the area last week said the Nazis have been quiet neighbors. Except for a swastika adorning the front door, there is little indication of their presence.

A party member, dressed in a white shirt and Nazi armband and armed with a revolver, greeted a visitor at a "duty station" right inside the door, then quickly secured a back

office by closing the door. Party publications filled a magazine rack. There was no sign that the group was preparing to move out.

National Commander Matt Koehl recently warned party members that the IRS had threatened to seize the headquarters and other party property tomorrow if the taxes weren't paid.

In a last-minute fundraising appeal, Koehl offered to sell the headquarters or 1-acre parcels of land the party owns in the Midwest to members. Members also were invited to contribute \$2,000 to help refinance the Clarendon building, Koehl said.

"Remember, March 9 is the moment of truth," Koehl said in the three-page letter. "Whether we survive or go under on that day

may well depend on what you do — or don't do."

Party spokesman Kerr said Koehl's letter was sent in early February. In the appeal, Koehl told members the Arlington headquarters was assessed "at just under \$72,000, with fair market value estimated at 30 percent to 50 percent more."

A check of county records revealed the building, located four blocks from the Arlington Courthouse, was assessed at \$70,100 on Feb. 23. Last year, it was assessed at \$65,000.

The party has paid real estate taxes on the land, according to county records.

Today's meeting is the latest development in a long-running feud between the Nazis and

The government had set a Tuesday deadline for the party to pay \$26,000 in back taxes. The seizure deadline was set for 11 a.m. Thursday.

Kerr said the party had been told Koehl's matter was being turned over to the enforcement division, he said.

Seizure of the party's national headquarters, located at 2507 N. Franklin Road, could come at any time, Kerr said.

In a sudden death overtime move, the party had an appointment with the IRS late Tuesday.

A spokeswoman for the agency's regional office in Richmond said the IRS does not always seize the headquarters of the party, Susan Linden-Brooks said. The agency can take several courses of action against delin-

quent taxpayers.

"It really depends on the facts and circumstances of each case. It really depends on how much property is involved and whether it is being used in carrying out the liability," Kerr said.

Kerr said the party made two partial payments earlier this week, but would not disclose the unpaid balance. The payments were made under protest because the party contends they should not have to pay taxes on unsolicited contributions to the party, he said.

### Tax lien filed against Nazis

Arlington, Va. — AP — The Internal Revenue Service has filed a lien for more than \$37,000 in back taxes against the National Socialist White People's Party, according to a spokesman for the self-described racist, right-wing organization.

For the past two months, the party has tried unsuccessfully to raise the money from its members. Matt Koehl, leader of the Arlington-based party, met Monday with federal tax representatives but failed to win an extension on payment.

The party is contending it should not have to pay taxes on what it says were unsolicited political donations.

Kerr noted that tomorrow marks the 23rd anniversary of the party's creation and the birthday of party founder George Lincoln Rockwell.



## Nazis Pay \$26,000 Tax Bill

The National Socialist White People's Party won't be evicted from its Arlington headquarters after all, according to a party spokesman.

Martin Kerr told The Journal on Friday that the party has paid all but approximately \$1,000 of \$26,000 in back taxes being sought by the IRS. The rest of the money should be turned over this week, Kerr said.

The federal agency threatened to seize the Nazi group's property, including its building at 2507 N. Franklin

St., last Tuesday unless the party paid the delinquent taxes. Nazi Commander Matt Koehl made two payments last Monday, Kerr said. A third payment was made late last week.

However, the Nazis aren't out of the woods yet, Kerr said. The IRS has found a technical error in the party's 1975 return and wants to collect an additional \$6,500 one month from now, he said.

The revolutionary party, founded in 1929, claims it shouldn't have to pay taxes on unsolicited contributions from party members and friends.

## IRS Moves to Seize Home Of White People's Party

The Internal Revenue Service has filed a lien for more than \$37,000 in back taxes against the Arlington-based National Socialist White People's Party, a self-described racist, extreme right-wing organization.

A party spokesman said yesterday the group has been notified that seizure of its headquarters, an aging, two-story building four blocks from the Arlington County Courthouse, is imminent.

Federal tax officials filed the lien last month in Arlington Circuit Court.

After two months of unsuccessful attempts to raise the money from members, party leader Matt Koehl met on Monday with IRS representatives, but failed to win an extension of the deadline. According to party spokesman Martin Kerr, the matter has now been turned over to the IRS enforcement division.

"We gave them what we could, but they didn't come through with an extension. They don't want the money, they want blood," said Kerr, seated in the party's cramped front office, surrounded by anti-Semitic literature

and a portrait of Adolf Hitler.

According to Kerr, the party claims it should not have to pay taxes on what it says were unsolicited political donations. Kerr attributes IRS scrutiny to a Reagan administration vendetta against the group.

Earlier this year, an urgent letter signed by party "Commander Matt Koehl" went out to members and supporters soliciting financial help. ## Nazis Claim To Have Stalled IRS

### Feds Threaten To Seize Headquarters For Back Taxes

ARLINGTON — The National Socialist White People's Party, known as the Nazi Party, has stemmed for a period Internal Revenue Service seizure of its headquarters building at 2507 N. Franklin Road, Martin Kerr, a Nazi spokesman said Tuesday.

Kerr said his group has agreed to repay a "substantial" portion of back taxes the IRS said the Nazis owe on unsolicited donations from 1979 and 1980. Kerr, Nazi national organizer, said the IRS claims his party owes about \$33,000 in back taxes.

Kerr indicated the IRS has refused any further extensions for payment and "reneged" on a previously approved installment plan for repayment. He said the IRS has forwarded the issue to its collection enforcement action unit.

The IRS had threatened to seize the party

headquarters valued at \$70,000 as repayment. But on Tuesday, Kerr said he was not sure when the enforcement action unit's activities would begin. Kerr would not say how much of its tax bill the party had paid.

Susan Linden-Brooks, a spokeswoman for IRS in the Richmond office, said she could not discuss the specifics of the case. She explained that the enforcement activities regulations of IRS could mean seizing private property.

The IRS has filed a tax lien against a corporation run by the Nazis, called NS Publications, a corporation trading as New World Order Inc. That lien states \$37,025.15 is owed in back corporate taxes. The lien was filed Jan. 6, 1982.

Kerr said NS Publications is one of several corporations started by the group. He

said the \$37,000 figure is no longer used by the IRS. It is now \$26,000, he said.

The IRS and the Nazis have had differences previously. In 1966, Kerr said, the IRS seized the party headquarters which at that time was on North Randolph Street.

Kerr indicated the Nazis maintain they are a political party and as such should not have to pay income taxes on gifts or donations.

In order to pay off its tax debts, the Nazis offered one-acre parcels of land owned in the Midwest to its members for \$3,000. It also suggested someone may want to buy its headquarters building, located in an area the county is intent upon designating as an increased density parcel.

Fraser answered Comrade Martinson's letter with a reply saying how pleased he was that the ADL was gracious enough to appoint him to the "Human Rights Coalition" which it had set up. He also extolled the supposed "virtues" allegedly derived from living in a multiracial society.

## **WPM Boosts CF Fundraiser**

Multiple-choice question: The purpose of the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation is to (a) Help the victims of this genetic disease that attacks mainly White people of Northern European ancestry; (b) Help find a cure for this dread killer of Whites; (c) Involve itself in anti-National Socialist politics; or (d) All of the above.

The answer is (d), at least in the greater Washington area.

A White Power Message was broadcast from Arlington in January explaining the nature of CF, and urging people to participate in a fundraising event which the Cystic Fibrosis Foundation was holding in Washington, D.C., on 30 January.

The message was recorded late one evening, and by the next morning the CF Foundation was frantically telephoning National Headquarters with the demand that the Party take the message off the air at once. According to Greg Hollinger, Assistant Director of the Metropolitan Washington Chapter of the group, the foundation's policy is not to accept "endorsement" from any organization. He went on to say that

the foundation specifically rejected the endorsement of the Party.

The message was *not* removed. The fundraising event was reportedly a great success.
