| 1. Race | (Capitalized when a specific race is mentioned, or when referring to <u>our</u> Race) |
| 2. race | (Lower case when used as a noun in reference to race in general, or in secondary reference to another race) |
| 3. race, racial | (Lower case when used as an adjective describing things racial, unless appearing in a proper name) |
| 4. White | (Always capitalized when used, either as a noun or adjective, as a racial term) |
| 5. White Race | (Each word capitalized, because it is the proper name of a particular race) |

6. White Man (Both words capitalized only when referring to the White Race as a collective entity, regardless of sex or age)
7. White man ("Man" lower case when referring to an individual White adult male)
8. black (Lower case when used in the moral sense)
9. Black (Capitalized when used, either as a noun or adjective, as a racial term)
10. Black Race (Each word capitalized, because it is the proper name of a particular race)
11. Black Man ("Man" capitalized only when referring to the Black Race as a collective entity, regardless of sex or age)
12. Black man ("Man" lower case when referring to an individual Black adult male)
13. Negro (Capitalized as either a noun or adjective, because it is used as a racial term)
14. Jew (Capitalized as either a noun or adjective, because it is used as a racial term)
15. Jewish (Capitalized because it is used as a racial term)
16. Jewish Question (Each word capitalized, because it is the proper name of a particular, outstanding racial issue)
17. kosher (Lower case, because it is secondary racial description)
18. kike (Lower case, because usage is vulgar and/or derogatory)
19. nigger (Lower case, because usage is vulgar and/or derogatory)
20. Western Culture (Each word capitalized, because it is the proper name of our particular racial culture)
21. Western Society (Each word capitalized, because it is the proper name for the social system within our culture)
22. Western World (Each word capitalized, because it is the proper name for our particular cultural sphere)

D. American Terms

1. American nation ("Nation" lower case, because it is used in a geographical, rather than a racial sense)
2. American Republic (Both words capitalized, because it is the proper name of our idealized American system)
3. Authoritarian Republic (Both words capitalized, because it is the name of our advocated system)
4. capital (Lower case when used to indicate the seat of government, local, state or federal)
5. Capitol (Capitalized, because it names a particular building)
6. Constitution (Capitalized when referring to the Constitution of the United States)
7. Constitutional (Capitalized when used as an adjective describing the Constitution of the United States)
8. Income Tax (Capitalized when referring to an American institution)
9. income tax (Lower case when referring to the amount an individual taxpayer is obligated to pay)
10. President (Capitalized when referring to the President of the United States)

11. Presidential (Capitalized when used as an adjective describing the President of the United States)
12. White House (Capitalized, because it is the proper name of the President's residence)

6. Party publications: all caps (ROCKWELL REPORT; THE STORMTROOPER)
7. Books and newspapers: underscored when typing; italics when printing
8. numbers: one through nine, written out; 10 or over, numerals used
9. dating: day, month, year (20 April 1964); except when using all numerals (4/20/64)
