Washington, D. C.

The first annual Assembly of Racist Movements met in Washington, D. C., April 20 and 21, to coordinate activities of white racist organizations in opposition to civil disturbances in the nation's cities.

Delegates of twelve organizations met in a two day session to codify a common political approach, develop methods and techniques for electing white racist officials, and establish channels for cooperation among the groups represented. Approximately thirty-five delegates and observers were present.

The delegates agreed to meet annually, and appointed an advisory board for interim action. They unanimously adopted a four-part program:

(1) National citizenship must be based on race, and, in the United States and Canada, must be limited to persons of the white race.

(2) The US and Canada must recognize and assist other nations with a white racist regime, and work toward an international white imperium.

(3) Government must institute a eugenics program for betterment of the race.

(4) Government should continue, and even expand, social welfare programs beneficial to the race -- especially programs for the ill, the aged, and families of working men with limited income.
